Word of the Week: - Pronunciation

= the way in which a word is spoken out loud

= the accepted standard of the sounds and stress patterns of a syllable, word, phrase etc.

What is the correct **pronunciation** of your name, please?

He struggled with his **pronunciation** of the word 'colonel' as he had only ever seen it written down before.

Spell it:

If the verb is 'to pronounce', what happened to the second 'o' to make it pronunciation?

The word pronunciation ultimately comes from the Latin verb pronuntiare. But, when the Latin Verb was taken into taken in to Anglo-French and later entered Middle English, that second vowel was sometimes rendered as -u- and sometimes rendered as -ou-. This meant that, from about the 1500s onward, both pronunciation and pronounciation were used. BUT! Eventually the noun standardised to pronunciation.



Stonewall became trans inclusive in 2015. Stonewall runs campaigns throughout the year, including the Rainbow Laces campaign, where National teams, leading clubs, top athletes, fans and grassroots players from across sport will show their support for LGBT people during: Rainbow Laces Week, 24th November – 3rd December 2017. Homestay Places for Chinese Students

Do you have a spare room?

We are looking for Homestay places in Bath for 30 Year 7 Chinese students (mixed sexes) for 8 weeks (away over Half term) during the Summer term 2018, from 28th April to 30th June. Dates may change depending on flight availability.

The students will be attending Beechen Cliff and Hayesfield in Year 7 and 8 lessons. They are here to improve their English and learn about our culture. As part of that we'd like them to also be part of a family life.

The students would be hosted individually or in pairs of the same sex within a home from home environment which provides daily home cooked meals, packed lunches and a bedroom with a study area. Ideally with an en-suite so they have their own privacy and space but sharing a bathroom is fine, if you can accommodate. Homes must ideally be within walking distance of both schools or be able to provide daily transport, if needed.



You do not need to have a son or daughter in Year 7 or 8 to offer a homestay placement, however, we would particularly welcome interest from families in those year groups and these will be given priority. If you can accommodate, to cover all living expenses including transport, we provide an allowance of £150 per person per week.
