## Theme of the Week-LGBT History Month

Theme of the week this week is about LGBT History Month, a month-long annual observance of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history, and the history of the gay rights and related civil rights movements.



LGBT History Month originated in the United States, and was first celebrated in 1994. LGBT History Month was initiated in the UK by [Sue Sanders](#), [Elly Barnes](#) and Schools OUT UK, and first took place in February 2005. The event came in the wake of the abolition of [Section 28](#) in 2003 and is intended to raise awareness of and combat prejudice against, an otherwise substantially invisible minority (Section 28 stated that a [local authority](#) "shall not intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality" or "promote the teaching in any [maintained school](#) of the acceptability of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship". It was repealed in England in 2003).

Throughout February this year our theme is **Geography: Mapping the World**. It will be commemorating two events; the 30th anniversary of the passing of Section 28; and the fortieth anniversary of the murder by shooting of Harvey Milk, the USA's first out-gay elected councillor. The rainbow flag was launched in 1978, and its creator Gilbert Baker passed away last year.

'Geography: Mapping the World', has partly been chosen as the theme for this year's LGBT History Month now that Australia and up to 16 more central and South American nations have legalised same sex weddings.



On 21<sup>st</sup> February Stuart Milk will be visiting us to speak with Year 9, Year 10 and our Equalities Team about LGBT inclusion. He will also meet with Sixth Formers and staff to

discuss how we as a school can become more inclusive. Stuart Milk is the nephew of Harvey Milk, the iconic civil rights leader. **Stuart Milk** is an international human rights activist, LGBT rights speaker, government relations consultant, and youth advocate. He is the co-founder and

Board President of the all-volunteer Harvey Milk Foundation. Mr Milk successfully led campaigns for the establishment of the now annual Harvey Milk Day holiday in California and Milks' induction into the California Hall of Fame and he accepted on behalf of his uncle the highest civilian honour in the US, the Medal of Freedom, from President Barack Obama. Mr Milk has worked with and alongside local and national LGBT organizations on six continents in both official matters with legislative and governmental entities as well as in capacity building events and demonstrations. He has been an official delegate abroad on Human Rights issues and often serves as a representative and liaison for formal and informal dialogue with foreign policy leaders. He frequently gives major keynote addresses at political conferences and conventions, international congresses, LGBT pride events, public demonstrations and parades, film and educational festivals and equality summits. Mr Milk has led collaborative international congresses on minority inclusion, diversity education, and workplace acceptance. Having over two decades of leadership experience in both public and private workforce programs, he often consults with business and community organizations finding the intersection of economic growth and social progress.

We look forward to welcoming Mr Milk to Beechen Cliff as part of our recognition of LGBT History Month.
