

## GCSE assessment reforms from 2015 onwards

GCSEs are being reformed with the new specifications being taught from September 2015 onwards.

The new GCSEs are linear courses with assessment predominantly by external exam at the end of Year 11. They will be will also be graded differently (from 9-1 rather than A\*-G).

In the new grading system a grade 4 will roughly be aligned with a grade C and a grade 7 will roughly be aligned to a grade A.

In the short term we will report pupil's current working grade with both numerical and letter grades e.g. Grade 2 (E), Grade 4 (C) or Grade 8 (A/A\*).
