## Message from the Headmaster

Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to all our pupils and students; new and established. I hope the summer break has been a positive one and that every member of the school has come back with the expectations that the year ahead will be successful and productive.

The summer saw Beechen Cliff pupils and students achieve great success in A Level and GCSE examinations. 30% of A level grades were A\*/A and we saw 140 youngsters win their places at university. An exceptional 25% of students achieved AAB or better in at least two facilitating subjects (national average 13%) and the 'added value' achieved was very positive.

At GCSE 82% of boys achieved A\*-C including English and Maths with more than 35% of grades being A\*/A. The 'value added' achievement of the school put it in the top 20% nationally and, more importantly, meant that boys at the end of Year 11 were able to make positive choices about their next steps.

The Sixth Form, numbering over four hundred students, has been a very popular destination for boys and girls from Beechen Cliff and beyond. We wish them every happiness and success as they begin their 'A' Level studies.

The Bath Academy Beechen Cliff rugby squad has been training hard over the summer and this dedication saw its reward when Beechen Cliff played Ivybridge (Exeter Chiefs) and won 36-8 last week in the first competitive game of the season.

As always at the start of the year I would ask that every new boy or student in the school considers how they can contribute to our success as a school community and how they will challenge themselves to be the best they can be over the year. The staff at Beechen Cliff will aim to make it possible to achieve these aspirations.

Let us hope for another good year.

- Available as an app!

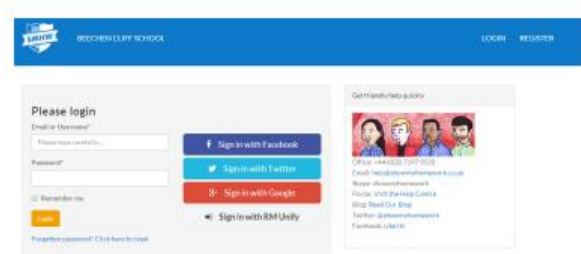
All new pupils have been given a letter with unique log in details for you and themselves that will give you both access to the site to see the homework that has been set. (See details below).

Students in the Sixth form also have access to the site and all new Lower Sixth Students will be given login details this week.

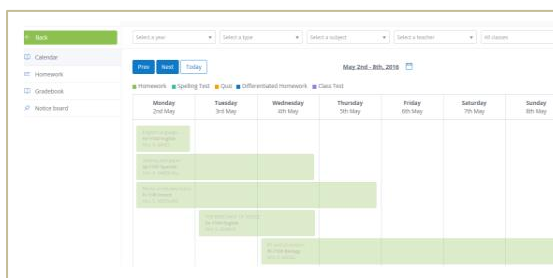

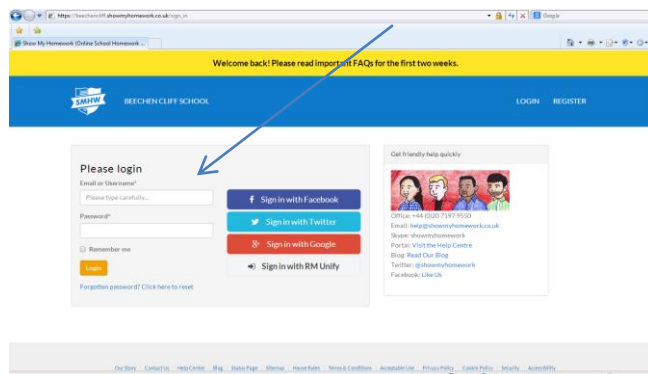


2. If you click on the calendar icon in the welcome bar you can see your set homeworks and due dates in calendar form as below.

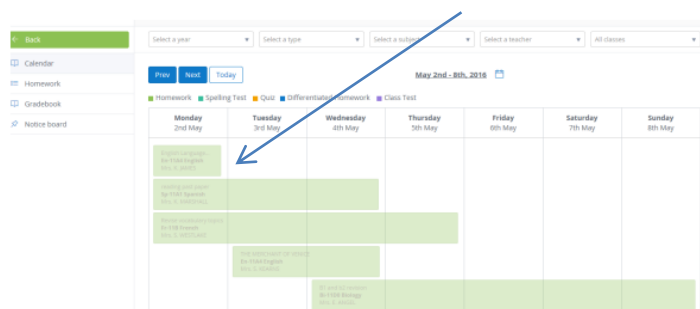


## Show My Homework – For Parents and Carers.....
