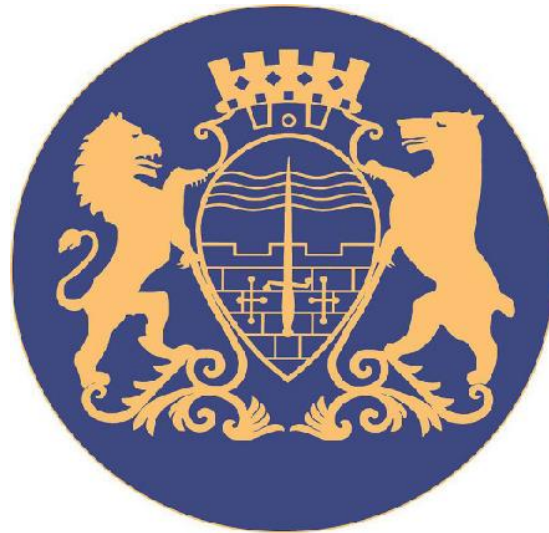


E-TEAM





WHAT IS EQUALITY?

- Equality is about ensuring that every individual has an equal opportunity to make the most of their lives and talents, and believing that no one should have poorer life chances because of where, what or whom they were born, what they believe, or whether they have a disability.



ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

- Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.
- A survey of over 11,000 secondary pupils in England and Wales reported that **11%** said they had been bullied a lot and **33%** sometimes.
- Of those bullied, **88%** reported it happening in school, also **31%** out of school, **15%** in cyberspace, **13%** on a mobile phone, and **15%** on the journey to/from school.



WHAT IS AN E-TEAM?

- E-Teams are designed to meet the needs of each individual school that they are set up in. It is a group of young people and adults that work together with a common purpose.
- **A Forum for Equalities topics**
- To voice common concerns across all ages in the school. Time is given to discuss issues and develop ideas on how they could be improved.
- **A Campaigning role.**
- We would aim to inspire the wider community and get people involved in taking action and negotiating change.
- **Assessing strengths, problems and progress.**
- Whilst incidents of inequality need to be addressed, it is also important to remember that the new E-Team will also be celebrating achievements and progress made in making the school a more equal place.

E-TEAM GOALS

- Establish areas that can be improved:
Racism, Bullying, Stereotyping, etc. - Survey
- Raise awareness of key issues throughout school – Assembly, themed days, posters, speakers and worry box etc.
