Theme of the Week

Theme of the week this week is focusing on Anti-Bullying week.



Assemblies are taking place

this week to introduce the new Equalities Team we are setting up in school; the Equalities Team will help raise awareness of issues within the school such as Bullying and try to tackle improving them.

A survey of over 11,000 secondary pupils in England and Wales reported that 11% said they had been bullied a lot and 33% sometimes.

Of those bullied, 88% reported it happening in school, also 31% out of school, 15% in cyberspace, 13% on a mobile phone, and 15% on the journey to/from school.

Prejudice-based bullying can come in many forms:

Sexist: Sexist and sexually aggressive behaviour is a major form of bullying. This often includes unwanted physical touch, name calling and spreading rumours.

Homophobic, biphobic and transphobic: An intolerance of a person's sexuality or perceived sexuality can lead to bullying. People are also bullied because they are not seen to conform to 'gender norms' (i.e.how society says a boy or girl should behave').

Race and faith targeted bullying: Bullying targeted at someone's actual or perceived race, or their faith as in Islamophobia, is common.

Disability: A recent study has shown that at 7 and at 15 years, disabled children and those with special educational needs (SEN) are around twice as likely to be bullied than their non-disabled peers.

A significant amount of bullying behaviour is targeted at real or perceived difference. These differences are what make us unique as individuals. They should be respected and celebrated.

We are looking for Homestay places in Bath for Sixth Form Chinese students (mixed sexes)

from Thursday 12th January to Wednesday 25th January 2017.

The students will be attending Beechen Cliff and Hayesfield and in Sixth Form lessons. They are here to improve their English and learn about our culture. As part of that we'd like them to also be part of a family life.

The students would be hosted individually or in pairs of the same sex within a home from home environment which provides daily home cooked meals, packed lunches and a bedroom with a study area. Ideally with an en-suite or sharing a bathroom with one other person so they have their own privacy and space. Homes must ideally be within walking distance of both schools.

You do not need to have a son or daughter in the Sixth Form to offer a homestay placement. However, we would particularly welcome interest from families with sons/daughters in those year groups or school.

If you can accommodate, living expenses are £20 per person per night. So, for the full placement that would be £260 per person.
