Theme of the Week

Theme of the week this week is about the National Day of Non-Violence, which takes place on 25th September.



“Non-violence is the greatest force at the disposal of mankind. It is mightier than the mightiest weapon of destruction devised by the ingenuity of man” (Mahatma Gandhi).

The UN promote an international day of non-violence on the 2nd October which celebrates the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi, leader of the Indian independence movement and pioneer of the philosophy and strategy of non-violence.

The Stand Against Violence campaign has created a National Day of Non Violence to remember those who have lost their lives to violence, like Lloyd Fouracre did in 2005. The 25th September was Lloyd’s birthday and they remember him by celebrating a national day of non-violence in the hope that no more lives will be taken unnecessarily by the violence within our communities.

Seventeen year-old Lloyd Fouracre was leaving a friend's 18th birthday party on 25 September 2005 in Taunton, Somerset, when he and his friends were attacked by a group of youths.

He was hit over the head with a wooden parking sign, rendering him unconscious. His attackers then continued to beat Lloyd until they were interrupted by a passing car.

Lloyd was taken to Musgrove Park Hospital, where he was pronounced dead 30 minutes later. A post-mortem examination revealed Lloyd had suffered fractures to the skull, cheekbone, jaw, eye socket, nasal bone and suffered multiple brain haemorrhages. He was due to turn 18 on 26 September 2005, the day after he died.

Word of the Week: Notwithstanding

= in spite of
= despite the fact or the thing mentioned
= nevertheless
= often used to create or highlight exceptions in a legal contract

- ✓ Do you **know** it?
- ✓ Can you **spell** it?
- ✓ Can you **use** it correctly in your work this week?

Use it:

We decided to go anyway, notwithstanding the weather forecast. His relations with his neighbours, differences of opinion notwithstanding, were unfailingly friendly.

In a legal context:

‘Notwithstanding’ is used in a clause that is to take priority over another clause. It tells the reader that the subject clause overrides the clause(s) to which it refers.

Example:

Clause 1: Notwithstanding any other provision of this agreement...

Spell it:

(Yes, it is one word!) - **Not/with/standing**

It originates from the Old French ‘non obstant’, meaning ‘not providing an obstacle to.’

Whilst in Iceland you will visit Geysers, boiling mud, hot springs, the Blue Lagoon, the Icelandic version of the Giant's Causeway, a geothermal power station, go glacier hiking, visit resplendent waterfalls, climb Eldfell on the Westmann Islands and walk the Mid-Atlantic Ridge!

Prayer Meeting


A number of Christian parents from various churches across Bath meet termly to pray for the Hayesfield and Beechen Cliff School communities.
