

This week we're also rolling out a new, long-lasting sanitising treatment across our entire fleet, which kills Coronavirus on surfaces. The treatment is effective for 28 days, is environmentally-friendly, and is scientifically proven to be highly effective against Covid-19. It is the latest addition to our already enhanced cleaning regime. Our buses will be treated every 28 days with this "invisible shield", which attracts and kills organisms and is the latest cleaning enhancement in addition to the daily disinfection of all customer touchpoints onboard


Helping you travel with confidence

Mental Health & Well-being

Last week, we introduced you to 3 Solution Focused (SF) questions. We invited all students, parents and staff to ask themselves these 3 SF questions. We invited you to notice what strengths and resources you (and your family) have used to help you get through lockdown. We also asked you to think about what your best hopes are during these unprecedented times. We asked you to give yourself a number on a scale of 1-10, in relation to where you felt you were currently in terms of reaching your best hopes. This week, using the same 3 questions, we ask you to reflect on your week and notice if you have moved on the same scale.

1. *On a scale of 0 to 10, with 10 being you at your best and 0 being the opposite of that, where are you on the scale since last week?*
2. *What have you noticed about yourself that has pleased you and makes you that number and not lower?*
3. *Now you have looked where you are on the scale in relation to being at your best, describe what being at your best would look like for you, and what small sign would tell you that you were moving a small step towards being at your best?*
