Three Peaks Challenge 2021

The Three Peaks Challenge involves the ascent of the three highest mountains in Scotland, Wales and England over, without undue stopping for rest or sustenance. It takes place over a three-and-a-half-day period which includes the one day travel to our hostel in Glasgow, travelling to the first mountain and an overnight stay after our last mountain. 1200 miles of driving, over 3000 metres of ascent and distance walked will exceed an Olympic marathon.

This year's three Peaks Challenge will take place Friday 2nd July – Monday 5th July. Open to just 28 pupils from all years. Pupils need to register their interest to organisers (Mr Stewart or Mr Brewer and complete a Medical Form). Successful pupils and students will be notified.
