



Northern Ireland Visit

As Beechen Cliff is a lead school for the local strategic alliance 'Boys in Mind' (Girls Mind Too) whose work is to prevent male suicide. We were honoured when Kate Murphy from 'Boys in Mind' asked Susie Ingram (Beechen Cliff Sixth Form Pastoral Manager and Mental Health Champion) to join them on a trip to Belfast, last week, to formally launch their partnership with the fabulous Lighthouse Charity. Lighthouse Charity is an organisation committed to the prevention of suicide, the promotion of positive mental health and the provision of support services to families who have been bereaved due to suicide in Northern Ireland.

Ex-Beechen Cliff student and now 'Boys in Mind' Youth Advisor, Will Reid also joined the team for this trip. They spent the day with the charity's Mentor Training Coordinator, Gary Symington, Sinead Mckilvenna (Trauma Counsellor) and some of Lighthouse Charity's young men, Ryan Carlin, Conor Leo Muldoon & Donal Geehan, who participated in a group work programme after losing their friend. They were also joined by Lighthouse Charity's first ever Endeavour Mentors, Marty Smith & Niall McMullan who mentor young male students in schools in Northern Ireland. All the lads got a chance to talk openly about their work and Susie and Will were able to share the impact of the student-led mental health work at Beechen Cliff and to share resources.

'Boys in Mind's' filmmaker, Andrew Hassenruck, did a fabulous job meeting the boys and helping them to film each other talking about their experience. This will be the first in a series of powerful films about the important work being done by young people at the Lighthouse Charity with the shared aims of 'Boys in Mind' (Girls Mind Too) to prevent suicide in young men. What can we do to embrace and celebrate diversity?

Who can think of someone who doesn't let their disability get in the way of their dreams and ambitions?

Inspirational Bath based seven-year-old Harmonie-Rose Allen won a Pride of Britain Award this month.

The Quadruple amputee was given a 10 percent chance of survival as a toddler and has inspired Bath and the nation with her courage and unbreakable spirit. Harmonie-Rose contracted meningitis and septicaemia in 2014, when she was aged 10 months. It resulted in her limbs and part of her nose being amputated.



Harmonie-Rose has won the 'Child of Courage' award for her incredible strength and bravery. She is a wonderful example of living her life to the fullest and embracing her disability.

This week in assemblies and tutor time we have been discussing ideas for small changes people could make to ensure everyone in our community feels they were being treated equally.

What the Equality Act says about disability discrimination

The [Equality Act 2010](#) says that you must not be discriminated against because:

- you have a disability
- someone thinks you have a disability (this is known as discrimination by perception)
- you are connected to someone with a disability (this is known as discrimination by association)

It is not unlawful discrimination to treat a disabled person more favourably than a non-disabled person.

What is classed as a disability?

In the Equality Act a disability means a physical or a mental condition which has a substantial and long-term impact on your ability to do normal day to day activities.

You are covered by the Equality Act if you have a progressive condition like HIV, cancer or multiple sclerosis, even if you are currently able to carry out normal day to day activities. You are protected as soon as you are diagnosed with a progressive condition.

You are also covered by the Equality Act if you had a disability in the past. For example, if you had a mental health condition in the past which lasted for over 12 months, but you have now recovered, you are still protected from discrimination because of that disability
