Message from the Headteacher

Dear parents and carers,

This week we have responded to the Government's latest guidance for schools and I would like to thank you for your support in providing face coverings for pupils to wear in communal areas in school.

We are following the BANES Public Health Guidance and have moved all mixed year group assemblies from in-person to remote until Christmas. Year group assemblies will only take place in-person in the weeks ahead if the number of cases in the school community remains low and below the threshold. As a further mitigation should assemblies take place pupils will be asked to wear face coverings (unless they are exempt) and the assembly hall will be well ventilated.

Around the school we continue to remind pupils of the importance of good respiratory and hand hygiene and to ensure spaces are well ventilated.

All pupils and their families are also encouraged to continue with regular lateral flow testing at home and to report results via the gov.uk website and via the link on the front page of the School Website. If you require a further supply of LFT tests please ask your child to request a box from the main school office.

Over the last two weeks of term we are currently planning to go ahead with the events shown on the calendar, with the appropriate risk assessments and mitigations in place. We will, of course, inform parents if any changes need to be made.

After the Christmas holidays the Government has asked schools to organise covid testing for all secondary age pupils on their return school. The first day back for pupils is scheduled for Thursday 6th January and we expect to complete testing on 6th and 7th January. A full schedule of the arrangements, information on testing and a link for parents to provide consent will be provided before the end of term.

Update to NHS Test and Trace and Isolation guidance

If you have COVID-19 <u>symptoms</u> you should stay at home and self-isolate immediately. You should <u>arrange to have a PCR test</u> as soon as possible. If this PCR test result is positive, you must continue to self-isolate.

If you do not have COVID-19 symptoms, but you have a positive PCR test result, you must stay at home and self-isolate.

If you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, you must stay at home and self-isolate if you are not fully vaccinated or if they have been identified as a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19.

If you live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 that has not been identified as a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant, and you are fully vaccinated or aged under 18 years and 6 months, you are not required to self-isolate.

You may be entitled to a one-off payment of £500 through the <u>NHS Test and Trace Support Payment</u> scheme if you are required to stay at home and self-isolate or you are the parent or guardian of a child who has been told to self-isolate

Vaping Concerns

Dear Parents,

It has come to our attention that some pupils are vaping outside school and even occasionally in school. We would like to be clear that pupils caught vaping, or suspected of doing so, will be sanctioned in line with our behaviour policy. Should any pupil be found to be selling vapes in school, the sanctions will be greater still, and we will also conduct searches of a pupil's bag should we suspect they have vapes on them. All three of the above will result in contact with you as parents.

In order to tackle the issue of vaping, which is becoming increasingly prevalent in schools across the city, we have arranged for a public health professional to meet with a group of pupils that we know, or strongly suspect, are vaping. Parents of these pupils will be contacted prior to the meeting to gain your permission and we will give feedback to you afterwards. We have also arranged for the Police to come in if we suspect that any pupils are selling vapes in school.

If you are concerned your son is vaping and would like him to be involved with the educational support for him, please email your son's Head of House in confidence.

Message from the Deputy Head

Rewards - Over the last two weeks of term we will be rewarding pupils in a wide range of ways. These will include subject awards in every year group for progress and commitment to learning, awards for individual pupils with the highest number of positives, and tutor group and House awards for the winning aggregated groups. You can check how many positives your son has been given by logging into Insight. We are awarding additional positives for punctuality in the next week, with bonus points for every pupil who is on time every day (unless for legitimate transport issues).

Safety in the community - next week we have planned assemblies on winter safety in the community. Ahead of this, I would like to draw parents' attention to two issues: firstly, the Police have notified us that some pupils have been seen in the abandoned building at the bottom of Monksdale Road. This is a <u>very dangerous</u> site and children should not enter it. Secondly, we have had reports of pupils being threatened to hand over their jackets when travelling to or from school. We would urge parents to discuss safety plans in the event of this happening and also to consider the types of coats and other valuables that pupils are bringing to school.

Uniform - thank you to parents for ensuring your son has the correct uniform for school every day. We have noticed a small number of pupils occasionally wearing white socks; often this is because they are not changing back into dark socks following a PE lesson. PE teachers do remind pupils to change back into school socks but I would be grateful if you could also remind your son of this for hygiene reasons.




