Message from the Deputy Head Teacher

Thank you to parents for ensuring your son has the correct uniform and equipment for school at the start of this term both are essential expectations we have for pupils to be ready for learning. Tutors have been checking this in the mornings and will contact you if there are any issues with either of these matters. For pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9, we also expect them to have a reading book with them every day.

Over the Christmas holiday, we know pupils often receive new items such as phones, clothes and, for a few this year, e-scooters. In respect of the former, please could you remind your son that his phone should be turned off in school and that he should only use it if directed to do so by a teacher. You will appreciate that phones are both very helpful learning tools, but also a distraction or problem if used inappropriately.

Regarding e-scooters, we do not permit these on the school site for safety reasons. Whilst there is some ambiguity about the law around these devices in Bath due to the city trialing their use, the following information is provided on the government website:

"Micromobility devices – such as electric scooters (e-scooters) – could help to solve the urban transport challenge of poor air quality stemming from increased congestion. However, they are currently banned from UK roads and pavements. Since 4 July, local areas have been able to run e-scooter rental trials, for use on roads, cycle lanes and tracks only, for up to 12 months. The trial end date has been extended to Spring 2022. While it is legal to buy or sell an e-scooter (classed as a battery-powered personal transport device), riding them on public roads, pavements or cycle lanes is against the law. Riders could face a \pounds 300 fine and six points on their licence if they use them on public roads or pavements. Riding e-scooters on private land is legal with the landowner's permission."

On a related note, if your son/daughter rides a bike to school, please could you remind him/her about safe cycling, especially on the Avenues. The Police were on Kipling Avenue yesterday and stopped a few pupils riding dangerously down the road, especially not stopping when crossing Chaucer Road.

Finally, I will be inviting pupils to join the school Equalities Team (E-Team) next week in assemblies. Please encourage your son/daughter to get involved if they share a strong belief in the importance of equality for all. There are many great opportunities for projects and collaboration across the school and more widely.

As we start the New Year, we are inviting you, as parents/carers, to think about what your best hopes are for the year ahead with your family. Writing down a list of these hopes together with your family members will provide a starting point and a set of small but achievable goals. Having some insight into what each family member is hoping to work towards is a really useful tool, not least because it enables us to encourage and compliment one another as we try to make these positive changes, however small.

By identifying our hopes, we are inviting our families to think about hopeful change that would make a difference to our family interactions in the months ahead. It is understandable that many of our students and pupils are still anxious about the possibility of another lockdown, with the current rise in Covid infections and the need to wear face masks again in school. As we think about the future for our children, when we hope that normality can resume, how they manage to handle these challenging times will become so important to them and us. We hope to help our young people notice their strengths and resources during these times of extreme uncertainty, so that they can build a toolkit of coping strategies that they can use in other times in their lives, when they hit the inevitable bumps in the road, and most importantly build personal resilience.


