Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

The Government has announced changes to national guidance and therefore from today pupils, students and staff are no longer required to wear face coverings in classrooms. For the time being we will still expect face coverings to be worn in communal areas so please continue to provide your son or daughter with a face covering to bring to school. Members of our community who wish to continue to wear face coverings in classrooms are welcome to do so.

We will be continuing with our other mitigations including good ventilation, enhanced cleaning and promoting good hand and respiratory hygiene. We also encourage everyone to continue with regular testing. For the next week at least we will be continuing with remote assemblies and will continue to review this on a regular basis based on the number of cases in the school community and both local and national guidelines. Currently we have 18 positive cases within the school community but are below the threshold in each individual year group.

During the last week Mr Oldham and Mr Mann have been promoting our E-team and Eco Group and we are encouraging pupils and students to get involved, have their voice heard and make a difference to the school.

The final preparations for our bands night on 31st January are taking place and I am grateful to our Sixth Form students, our Lower School Technicians and Mr Harriman for all their hard work on what promises to be an fantastic event.

Several hockey and football fixtures have taken place over the last week and we have a number of students representing BANES in the Avon Schools Cross Country Championships this weekend. It promises to be a busy weekend with our Ten Tors preparation also beginning on the Mendips. As ever I am delighted to see pupils representing the school and wish them every success.

From 11 January, people who receive positive lateral flow test results for Covid are required to self-isolate immediately and won't be required to take a confirmatory PCR test.

Parents of Year 11 students

Please be advised that there will be a set of in-class tests around the week commencing February 28th and this will include two formal days of assessments in the Sports Hall and Small Exam Centre covering English Language, Maths, Biology and Chemistry. All other subjects will run tests of approximately 45 minutes each during normal lessons and we will advise students directly in due course.

We have been randomly selected to run National Reference Tests and 30 boys have been selected, again at random, to sit a 60 min English/Maths test. This evidence is used by exam boards when setting grade boundaries in GCSE English language and maths. This evidence is vitally important as it will help Ofqual and schools to understand the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on learning.

Message from the Deputy Head Teacher

We have noticed a slight increase in pupils using mobile phones whilst they are moving around the site and, on a few occasions, in lessons. With respect to lessons, we would like to remind pupils and parents that phones should be turned off and stored in bags/coats, unless the teacher has explicitly given permission for phones to be used. As we increasingly use technology in school to enable and support learning, pupils are - and will continue to be - allowed to use phones if they have one when teachers determine it appropriate, for example for accessing quizzes or research.

Regarding phones around the school site, our rule is that pupils should not use their phone without permission from a member of staff; we appreciate pupils may, in exceptional circumstances, need to check the time or their timetable for example and in this situation, we ask them to request permission from a member of staff to do so. Otherwise, we expect pupils to store their phones turned off in their bag/coat. Failure to do so may result in the phone being confiscated for the remainder of the school day.

We acknowledge and support the valuable contribution that phones can make to learning and to your communication as a parent with your son/daughter. Our goal is to teach pupils how to use phones appropriately, particularly ensuring they do not cause any disruption to learning or prevent good social behaviour. Examples of where the latter is impeded would include pupils walking along looking at a phone, accessing social media or focussing on their phone instead of holding a conversation. As ever, we thank you for your support in this matter.

Theme of the Week–Holocaust Education Day

On Thursday 27th January Year 9 students will be off timetable in order to take part in Holocaust Education Day - this event will launch their Holocaust education taught through both History and RPE lessons this term, and also mark Holocaust Memorial Day. Pupils will have an introduction to the event from Mr Tobin and Ms Netto after tutor time, and then will take part in seven workshops throughout the day to learn about and reflect upon the Holocaust through different mediums; teachers from across different Faculties will deliver these workshops, which include:

- Starvation in the ghettos
- The Holocaust through literature
- An experience of liberation
- The genetics of racism
- Memorials in Berlin
- Art wings and escape
- The Holocaust through graphic art (Maus)

During period 5 pupils will come together as a year group to reflect on their day and take part in a session exploring the psychology of bystanders, the moral responsibility we have to uphold the values of equality, inclusion and diversity, and ask the question: the Holocaust - never again? During this session we will also launch a reflective project, more details of which will be shared with pupils via Google Classroom.

We feel it is important to mark Holocaust Memorial Day in this way, and know from previous years how much the pupils benefit from this focused time exploring the Holocaust in different ways.
