Beechen Cliff Three Peaks Challenge. FRIDAY JULY 1ST TO MONDAY 4TH JULY 2022



The Beechen Cliff Three Peaks Challenge is one of the many endurance challenges offered to students. It involves the ascent of the three highest mountains in Scotland (Ben Nevis), Wales (Snowdon) and England (Scafell Pike), without undue stopping for rest or sustenance. It takes place over a three and a half day period that includes: one day travel to the first mountain and half a day from the last mountain to home. In all there are over 1200 miles of driving, over 3000 metres of ascent, and the distance walked will exceed an Olympic marathon.



Whilst it is a challenge that will test the 'metal' of all participants, it is a group activity and team work is vital if the challenge is to be completed in the true spirit of adventure. Beechen Cliff still remains one of the few schools in the United Kingdom to undertake such an arduous challenge. This only made possible due to Beechen's expertise and experience in successfully organising this type of activity. With our dedicated team willing literally to go the extra mile. This challenge is, as always, an awesome and unforgettable adventure.





To Secure Your Place

There are **NO MEDICAL FORMS AVAILABLE ON LINE** for this activity. If you are interested you will first need to collect a uniquely numbered **Medical Form** from **Mr Stewart in the Science Faculty.**

There are only a maximum of 26 places available. Please return the completed form as soon as you can to either Mr Steward or Mr Brewer in person. The total cost for the adventure is £375.

This challenge is only open to years 9, 10, 11 and the sixth form.

Access to pay the £100 deposit on Parent Pay will be given to finally secure your place. The remaining £275 balance will need to be paid before $May\ 27^{th}\ 2022$ as we have to pay for all accommodation in full before the event.

We will of course comply with any of the COVID-Secure measures that remain in place at this time and should the challenge not be able to be untaken due to COVID restrictions then deposits will be returned in full.

Solution Focused Approach (SF)

At Beechen Cliff, staff are trained in the Solution Focused Approach and we use this approach in our conversations with our students and pupils in the school. At the end of last year, Tara Gretton and Susie Ingram (Accredited Solution Focused Practitioners) held a Saturday morning SF workshop for Beechen Cliff parents and were asked to give some tips on how to have a SF conversation with your children at home. In response to this request, we are delighted to be able to share some SF tips and questions that you can try out with your own families when you or your children are facing times of difficulty.

SF Conversation Guidance and Questions

- At difficult times we are often understandably consumed by the problem, and this can make it difficult to notice what we are doing to cope and manage.
- When we invite ourselves to focus on what is working and what we are doing well, no matter how small, it can bring about a sense of hope and therefore possibility.
- We would like you to invite your children to notice their strengths, resources and capabilities during times of difficulties no matter how small. We would invite you to do the same for yourself.
- Sometimes this can be a difficult question to answer; we would invite you to trust in the process, giving your children and yourselves time to think and formulate responses. We should emphasise how small it can be and maybe give our own examples.
- It is often so tempting to give advice in these situations; we would invite you to resist this and believe that in the process we are encouraging our children and ourselves to be agents of our own change. By doing this, we are enabling ourselves to have coping mechanisms to hand not only for now, but for the future.

If we notice the strengths and capabilities we have to cope with adversity and uncertainty then we will be able to cope with further challenges in our lives!

Questions you could ask -

- 1. What did you notice during the Covid lockdowns that you are pleased to notice about yourself?
- 2. What did you do to get through?

Follow up Questions -

- 1. What is it about you that enables you to do these things?
- 2. What difference are they making to you?
