Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a busy week it has been!

Sport is in full swing with large numbers of pupils representing the school at football, netball and hockey. A special mention must go to our girls netball teams, who competed against KES last week in some really competitive matches, and our Year 7 footballers who opened up their season with victories against QEH in the A, B and C team fixtures.

Yesterday some of our Sixth Form and Year 11 Mathematicians took part in the Senior Maths team challenge at Norton Hill School. Our two teams were placed in first and second place in the final standings and achieved an amazing full marks in the first two rounds as part of this competition. An exceptional result and congratulations to all involved.

It has been great to hear of more pupils joining the Eco group and E-team over the last week.. It is a real opportunity to have a voice and and we look forward to their contribution to developing aspects of school life in the future.

Finally the bands night on Monday was a resounding success and I would like to thank all the students involved in organising, performing and technical support. It was also an excellent opportunity to host bands from Hayesfield and St Marks as part of our collaboration within the Bath Hub.

In relation to curriculum and assessment both our Year 11 pupils and U6th students are working towards their spring assessments after half term as part of their preparation for GCSE and A Level examinations in the summer. We are expecting Examination Boards to provide more information on the content of the examinations on Monday.

Year 9 pupils are also completing their GCSE option choices and the deadline for submitting these via the online form on the website is 7th February.

World Book Day is only a month away. We place a big emphasis on reading to develop vocabulary and knowledge but also for enjoyment. We aim for all pupils to develop a love of reading and in the build up to World Book Day I urge everyone to read as regularly as possible. Remember there are lots of books available in the school library!

Finally, covid is still impacting on the school and the wider community. Toda we have a number of staff absent and pupils will have noticed additional cover lessons taking place. For this reason we have unfortunately had to postpone the Chepstow trip tomorrow. I am also aware that some students are currently self isolating. In School we are continuing to follow the advice of Public Health in relation to mitigations in place. As part of this please can I remind everyone of the importance of regular testing and encourage all pupils and students to test at least twice weekly. Test kits are available for pupils to collect from the school office.


The books are suitable for our Higher and Foundation GCSE course.



Mental Health and Wellbeing

Tara Gretton (one of our school's Accredited Solution Focused Practitioners) shares with us some really useful information about the teenage brain. She invites us to read a copy of 'Inventing Ourselves - 'The Secret Life of the Teenage Brain' written by the acclaimed author and neuroscientist. Sarah-Jayne Blackmore.

As we see our young people continuing to experience such a lot of post lockdown anxieties, now more than ever, it is the perfect time to learn about and help us understand what is happening to our teenagers neurologically. Sarah-Jayne really invites us to notice how our interactions with our teenagers differs with us as they go through adolescence.

She also talks about how and why young people are more vulnerable to risk taking and mental health issues during adolescence. She talks a lot about how exciting the teenage years are for young people and that this is a time of creativity, hope and possibility - an opportunity, a time where young people are inventing themselves and deciding who they want to be as they transition from teenager to adult.



As a Solution Focused (SF) School community. Tara explains how she works with young people using SF practice and how she explains this neurology of the teenage brain to them to help them to identify their own strengths and resources, as they are the true experts of themselves. In lockdown, we have witnessed some remarkable strengths and resources in our young people and these need to be celebrated.

Please take a few minutes to watch Tara as she talks about the Teenage Brain and Solution Focused Practice.


