### Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers

This week I have been so impressed with our pupils and students' ambition to help those affected by the conflict in Ukraine.

The PTA raffle to raise funds for the Disasters Emergency Committee, which is aiming to support those affected by the war in Ukraine, has raised over £2500 in two days which is an amazing feat

Next week additional fundraising opportunities will also take place on Friday when pupils and students will have the opportunity to wear an item of red clothing to school and donate to comic relief.

In the week ahead assemblies and tutor time will be focussing on National Careers week. Whilst Year 10 pupils and L6th students will be thinking about work experience placements we would encourage parents to discuss careers with pupils in all year groups and to regularly look at the careers section of our newsletter.

Also next week our Upper Sixth students will be taking their second set of Mock Exams and we wish them all the best for this important part of their preparation for the examinations in the summer.

Many of our pupils are currently in the final stage of rehearsals for the School Concert on 23rd/24th March and the School Production (Little Shop of Horrors) on 6-8th April. ### Alexandra Park/ Shakespeare Avenue - Road Closure for 2 weeks commencing 14th March 2022

Western Power works on electrical supply to Alexandra Park will commence w/c 14th March 2022. The works will require the park road and part of the public highway on Shakespeare Avenue to be closed for periods of time to allow the work to be completed safely. This will take up to 2 weeks.


### Beechen Cliff School Presents.....

### Year 8 Outward Bound Adventurous Activity in Wales - June 2022

We are pleased to offer an adventure activity over 2 days for year 8 pupils.

This will take place over a 2 week period in June. The intention is that 4 groups of 20 Year 8's will travel to Tir Y Cwm, the school outdoor activity facility in Wales. The adventure will consist of one day trekking across the Brecon Beacons with team building activities followed by an overnight stay at the hostel. The following day will be a canoeing adventure down the Wye in open Canadian canoes from Glasbury, before returning to school later that evening.

The minibuses will leave early on the first day from school and a packed lunch will be required. We will of course stop at the motorway services for a short comfort break and an evening meal, breakfast and lunch the next day will be provided. We will stop again at the motorway services on our return journey so students will require money to purchase a meal if required as we could return to school late evening.


It is important to remember that:

### Message from Deputy Headteacher

#### Attendance

Thank you to all parents for ensuring your child's good attendance at school. We appreciate the winter months have presented more than their usual challenge with COVID on top of seasonal illnesses. As the weather improves, and hopefully COVID and other illnesses abate, we hope to see a recovery in some pupils' attendance.

In order to give you some perspective on the impact of absence, we have attached to the newsletter a poster about the equivalence between attendance and missed lessons. You can check your child' attendance on Insight and then use this to approximate the number of missed days or lessons. As an example, attendance of 90% amounts to around 100 missed lessons over the course of an academic year. We would encourage you to share this information with your child so they understand the impact of absence.

If you are unsure about whether to send your child to school, we would urge you to do so and we can send them home if they are too unwell to stay. Often getting the day started at school encourages them that they can do the full day. Our Attendance Improvement Officer, Ms Gormley, is monitoring all pupils' attendance and will get in touch with you if we feel there is any support we can lend.

For those pupils whose attendance has been excellent so far this year, we are giving out some awards next week. Due to COVID, we will then effectively be 'resetting' the clock on attendance so that anyone who has 98% or above attendance from now until the end of the year can also receive a reward.

#### **Road Safety**

We have been told about several incidents recently in which pupils have put themselves at risk when travelling to and from school. Heads of House have talked to pupils about this in assemblies this week and we would ask that parents reiterate the message as well. Examples of issues reported to us include cycling too fast down Kipling Avenue and crossing the bottom of Wellsway by jumping over the railings, rather than using the underpass.

### Mental Health and Wellbeing



If you woke up this morning, looked at the news, and felt increasingly worried about the war in Ukraine, you are not alone. After a two-year pandemic, it's a lot to absorb, and experts agree that feeling overwhelmed is normal.

Sarah Kendrick, clinical director with text support service **Shout**, says she is particularly concerned about young people, who are typically on their phones a lot and accessing news 24/7.

"Children and young people are texting in saying they're worried about war, some say it's keeping them awake at night," she says. "They're up at night with access to their phones and with news alerts going off."

The guidance that **Shout** has been giving out sounds simple - turn off your phone at night and don't feel like you have to keep looking at the news - but it can be hard to put into practice.

Advice about how to support our children and young people, as the Ukrainian invasion unfolds, is starting to become more readily available and we are following the guidance in school and will share this with you as experts such as reputable mental health charity **Mind**, text support service **Shout** and child psychologists and counsellors with **Save the Children** publish their advice in the midst of this crisis.

Clinical psychologist Dr Emma Hepburn says "The advice I'd give to children is just as much relevant to the adults. You have to try hard to guard time where you just have fun and escape all of the bleakness. It's about having compassion for everyone including yourself."

Helping others is one of the <u>five steps recommended by the NHS</u> to improve mental wellbeing and there are countless ways to help with the Ukraine crisis.

A <u>number of charities have launched appeals</u>, including the British Red Cross, the UNHCR refugee agency and Unicef, while many individuals across the UK are raising money and collecting donations independently.

Dr Hepburn says that watching war unfold can make you feel out of control, and focusing on ways to help can manage that.

"There's lots of evidence that doing something for other people has a really beneficial impact on your own mental health. If we perceive that we made someone else feel good, we feel good. Our brains are designed to be social and have connections and creating a connection with something bigger than you is really beneficial to your wellbeing."

Please do read the full BBC article where you will find expert advice on how to support ourselves and our children with their mental wellbeing and at this critical time.
