Dear Parents and Carers,

Dropping Off/ Collecting Pupils - The Avenues and Greenway Lane

Please can we ask that you respect the local residents on both The Avenues and Greenway Lane. We have received a number of concerns from local residents that parents are using driveways on Greenway Lane to drop off their children and turn round and this is blocking access for those that live there. Please note that the lower fields entrance on Greenway Lane is not to be used as a pull in as it a private driveway so please use residential parking opposite the playing fields instead.

Many parents are also bringing their children to the main entrance of the school by car and dropping them off and collecting them near the school gates. To ensure the safety of pupils and out of respect to local residents I would be grateful if cars would not stop to drop off in the middle of the road or stop on the zig zag yellow lines outside the school gates. If you do have to drive up to school, please park in the marked bays on the side of the avenues or, if you are able to, please drop off lower down the hill or at Bear Flat (Majestic Wine are happy for their car park to be used as a drop off/ pick up point).

You may also be aware that there is an unofficial one way system in place on the avenues with cars driving up Shakespeare Avenue and down Kipling Avenue. We would appreciate if this is followed.



Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is Pupil Premium funding?

Pupil Premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 year
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces

At Beechen Cliff School, we get an extra £955 (for secondary schools) – these figures are for the 2021/2022 financial year, for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.

What does it mean if you are Pupil Premium at Beechen Cliff School?

We reserve a proportion of the top-up received for you and your child to decide how best to spend and can be spent on any of the following:

- · School uniform
- Stationery
- · School locker
- Music lessons (our usual offer is to pay 50% of 20 minute lessons which means parents pay around £20 per month and the school pay the remainder but this is calculated on an individual basis so do contact the school if you are interested in this)
- Subsidy for school trips
- Duke of Edinburgh and other extracurricular opportunities
- Loan of a personal laptop
- Revision guides
- Other key equipment for school such as a camera for photography GCSE

What is the rest of the money spent on?

The remaining money is spent on in school interventions which include:

- Literacy coordinator & reading programmes
- Additional technician support in science and technology
- Attendance support through the school's attendance officer
- Mentoring and mental health support
- · Careers support

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

Income Support

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Does my child have to eat the free school meals?

No. Pupils who are registered for free school meals do not have to eat them. If you are eligible but you want your child to have packed lunches you should still register because the school will receive the funding which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?

You only need to register once via B&NES.

Before you apply to B&NES

You will need to supply the following information accurately and in full for us to process your application:

- Dates of birth for you, any other parent and guardian, and all of your children (we may use this information to refer you to additional benefits or support that you may be able to get)
- · Contact details for you and any other parent or guardian
- Your National Insurance Number
- Your National Asylum Seeker Support Number (for applicants without a National Insurance Number)

Or call B&NES on 01225 39 43 17 to make a telephone registration. You will need to supply all of the details in the 'Before you apply to B&NES' section above. If the lines are busy, please leave a message with your telephone number, and they will call you back to complete your registration.

Year 8 Author Day - Luke Palmer


On Friday 8th July., some of our Year 8s will have the opportunity to participate in our first author visit. The workshop sessions will take place in the school library.

Gruff L will be fundraising for Children's Hospice South West. CHSW are a huge support to Gruff's family and his brother, who has significant complex needs and disabilities.



Be Tick Aware



At this stage of the year through various outdoor activities many pupil and students will be in areas where they could pick up ticks. These minute spider like insects are a parasitic and take blood from their host.


Ticks are normally easy to remove with tweezers and are quite common. However they can carry Lyme disease, which if untreated is extremely debilitating.

The incidence of this disease is more common in the warmer months so here is some advice on what to look for.





The rash is very distinctive and more commonly looks like a target/dart board. Please consult your doctor if you see this.

Clean Path – Green Bath

Repair the canal path to encourage walking and reduce the number of cars in Bath

As you are no doubt aware, this section of the Canal Tow Path is in a poor state, which makes walking and cycling difficult and even dangerous in wet weather, ice etc.

I am writing to ask for support in our campaign to have this stretch of the canal paved to make it accessible to everyone, year round.

The Canal & River Trust [CRT] has the resurfacing of the Bathwick Hill to Widcombe stretch of the Tow Path in its business plan for the current year [2022-2023]. Some funding for the project has been made available by B&NES and the CRT. **However, more funding is required for the project to be started.** There are compelling reasons why it is so important to Bath!


