Pupil Equipment and Reading Books

A reminder to all parents and carers about Beechen Cliff equipment requirements for pupils:

Every pupil is required to have a **pencil case** that contains the following items:

- * 2 x blue/black writing pen

In addition, pupils in Years 7-9 should have their **study planner** and **reading book** with them everyday.

Lost planners will require purchasing a replacement at a cost of £4, payable via Parent Pay. Missing equipment can be purchased in the school Library, either with cash, or items can be charged to Parent Pay if the pupil does not have cash on them.

Reading books can be borrowed from the school Library before and after school and at break and lunchtimes.

Energy Drinks

Please be aware that a number of students have been bringing energy drinks in to school. These are banned from the school site due to the impact these have on health and on young people's ability to learn. See below for further details.

ENERGY DRINKS: JUST THE FACTS

Get the facts on high-caffeine, high sugar energy drinks

These drinks are very popular with young people, but how healthy are they?

Energy drinks contain high levels of caffeine and sugar (in non-diet varieties), which can lead to health problems including:

- Feeling sick- being sick, stomach aches and diarrhoea
- Anxiety- panic attacks, feeling your heart pounding or having an irregular heartbeat
- Headaches and lack of concentration
- Affecting your mood – they may make you feel happy for a while and then you may feel really sad
- Insomnia and poor sleep
- Tooth decay
- Increase in weight
- Can become dependent on the caffeine or other substances
- Very occasionally, death. This has happened to young people with heart conditions, some of which can be undetected and those who have had too much caffeine

In 2018, a number of major supermarkets banned the sale of energy drinks to under 16's in the UK, and in 2019, the government announced it would ban the sale of energy drinks to children under 16.

Did you know?

Energy drinks that are high in caffeine have to be labelled 'high caffeine' and state that they are not suitable for young people.

Need an alternative?

Getting enough sleep is important. Search the NHS website for further advice if this is an issue.

Eat a balanced diet- eating healthy, regular meals will give you energy.

Exercise – when you feel like you have no energy, a quick HIIT workout, walk or run can make a big difference. Set your alarm 30 minutes earlier to give you a boost in the morning

Water – lack of water can make you feel tired and low in energy, so make sure you drink at least two litres of water a day

If all of the above doesn't help, try a cold shower to wake you up in the morning. Planning – if you are trying to stay awake to revise the night before an exam, you probably won't be able to concentrate and remember the information. Instead, make sure you plan revision and don't leave it all until the night before.

Reading Around the World Cup Inter-House Competition

Safety Information from Network Rail

Please see below some important information shared with the school by Network Rail.

As part of our Programme to electrify key rail routes across the mainline, the section of railway near your school will be under construction for the installation of the Overhead Line Equipment and be electrified. The safety of people on and around the railway is our priority and education in rail safety is key, especially for young people.

Network Rail is electrifying the routes to make journeys more reliable, greener and quieter for thousands of passengers. The electrification of one of Britain's busiest and oldest railways will improve connections between major towns and cities across England. Journeys will be smoother and more comfortable for passengers and quieter for people living near the railway.

The overhead lines will be energised at 25,000 volts AC, at 50Hz frequency. It is of course extremely dangerous for any person to come close to the overhead line equipment or any associated part of it, including the supporting masts, switch feeds and cables. There is no danger to any persons as long as they remain away from the railway boundary line and fencing.

Hundreds of people each year unintentionally take on the railway and lose. The railway's full of hidden dangers. If you're not hit by an unexpected train you'll be hit by the lethal current in rails and power lines.

You will be killed or left with catastrophic, life-changing injuries. And your friends and family will be left with the brutal consequences. Everyone loses when you underestimate this opponent. Everyone loses when you step on the track.



The Amazing Adolescent Brain! Top Facts!

The brain is the last human organ to develop fully, it's not fully grown until 30 years of age!!

As their brain tries to keep up with the rest of their bodies, it's only natural young people can be a tinderbox of emotions!!

The brain starts to develop from the back of the brain finishing at the front. So the prefrontal cortex is the last part to develop. And this happens quicker in girls than boys!!

So this may well explain some of the parent/career adolescent clashes!


Also, long term thinking is hard for young people because of how the brain develops. They are more prone to making decisions that are governed by the way that they feel as opposed to what adults deem rational!!
