Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our 'Best Hopes' for 2023

Happy New Year from us both and welcome to the first term of 2023. If you, like us, are still wondering what day of the week it is, then please know that you aren't alone!

We sincerely hope that you have all had an enjoyable Christmas break. The New Year often comes with a set of reflections about the past year and we think about our hopes for the year ahead. Many of you have signed up for the free Parent Solution Focused Training course that we are running next week on Thursday 12th January (Please see sign up details below to join us if you have not already done so)

'Best Hopes' are very much at the centre of every solution focused conversation that we have with young people and we look forward to sharing this with you in our parent training. When we work with your children, we always focus on what they would like to be different and we help them to notice that no problem or difficulty exists all the time; that there will always be exceptions, however small or rare. We encourage young people to notice these exceptions so that they might find the strength and resources to build on these; together we co-create change and a preferred future where the focus is not on the problem but on finding solutions. As we assume that all young people are the experts in their own lives, this approach is incredibly powerful at helping young people to regain control of situations where they may be having difficulties or struggling.

Below are just a few examples of very powerful Solution Focused questions that staff have been trained to use at Beechen Cliff with the young people we work with on a daily basis. If you would like to learn how to use these, and other tools, in your everyday conversations with your children, then we really do encourage you to sign up for the parent training below. We are very excited to meet with you next Thursday evening online.

Parent Solution Focused Training - Reminder

Last term, we sent out a Parent Questionnaire asking you if you would be interested in receiving some free Parent Solution Focused Training for how to have conversations with your own children. We are delighted to have had responses from over 100 families. Most families have said that their preferred time for the training would be in the evening. We are so excited to be able to offer this training to any Beechen Cliff parents and carers on Thursday 12th January 2023 from 6.00pm until 7.00pm.

If you would like to attend, please can you book your place using the Eventbrite link below. You will then receive further details and the Zoom link to join us closer to the time.







Three Super Curricular Talks in January/February for Science/Medicine students in Years 10—13


We have three Super Curricular talks coming up this Term aimed at Science/Medicine students.
