Thank you for the dedication of the students and parents to make the football programme such a success at Beechen Cliff.



Friday 24th February marks the one-year anniversary since Ukraine was invaded. A year of harsh conditions and living in peril for the citizens of Ukraine. To mark this event and help raise funds to send aid to the people of Oleksandriya we are holding a concert at Bath Abbey on Friday evening. We also wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the progress of our campaign to send generators to Oleksandriya in Ukraine. Following the successful delivery of 13 smaller generators in early January we were able to purchase a larger set powerful enough to provide energy to the children's hospital, this arrived in the city last week and now the hospital has a secure power supply.

Our next target is to purchase a larger generator for the general hospital in the city and continue with the supply of smaller units for schools, kindergartens and apartment blocks. The funds raised from our concert will help towards providing this.

We want to thank you for your efforts so far and encourage you to keep up your efforts.


