Ten Tors

Last Friday 29 Sixth form and Year 10 students traveled to Devon to take part in their first Ten Tors training exercise on Dartmoor itself. We had three teams of Year 12 students training to complete the 45 mile challenge, and two Year 10 teams for the 35 miles.

On Friday evening, they worked in their teams to organise their kit and plan their route along the north part of the moor for the following day before sleeping in teams overnight in the village hall.

It was a bright and early start on Saturday morning. By 7am the teams were all up, had eaten breakfast, packed and on the moor! It was a stunning morning, but was also bitterly cold with an easterly wind - at least they had a tailwind helping them along!

All teams completed the route for the day in good time, carrying all of their kit, reading maps, using their navigation skills and teamwork to stay on the correct route.

Next time they will be camping out on the moorland and walking the next day as well in preparation for the main event.







WORLD BOOK DAY VOUCHERS:

As we come into spring, we thought it would be nice to share with you some of the work our pupils and students have been creating recently.






Our year 7s have been working hard on a cultural project based on Indian Patterns. So far they have created beautiful title pages, mandalas and completed research on some important Indian Deities.







Oklahoma




