# Why is reading so important?

Children who read regularly:

- make far more academic progress over a shorter period of time
- are far more likely to achieve highly
- do an average of 15% better in all tests
- are exposed to 1.8 million words a year.





### Enjoyment of reading

Reading enjoyment	Pupils achieving less than expected	Pupils achieving as expected	Pupils achieving more than expected
Very much	2.4%	63.5%	34.2%
Quite a lot	4.2%	83.5%	12.3%
A bit	17.4%	75.8%	6.8%
Not at all	37.0%	54.9%	8.1%


#### The National Curriculum


 The KS3 and GCSE curriculum requires students to read challenging texts independently. GCSE exams are getting more complex.

# Asking questions to boost reading skills

- Predict: what might happen next?
- Question: what/where/who/why/how
- Clarify: what might that word mean?
- Summarise: what's happened so far?
