Spotlight on Languages at University of Bath

On Friday 30th June, 25 Year 7 linguists attended the 'Spotlight on Languages' event hosted for schools by the University of Bath. During the day, students heard from Professors of Modern Languages about the benefits of learning a foreign language and why further study of a foreign language is so important today.

Some of the reasons outlined were:

- The ability to make friends and communicate abroad.
- There is an increasing need for native English speakers who speak a foreign language in government, business, and journalism, especially post Brexit.
- The average salary for a bilingual employee is higher than that of someone without an extra language.
- The opportunity to work abroad.
- Increased understanding of other cultures- you can't fully understand another culture without speaking the language- leading to increased tolerance and collaboration.
- Benefits for the brain- learning another language slows down the development of conditions such as Alzheimer's and Dementia, and it improves your working memory.
- Learning a language is a fulfilling and fun experience!

The students' favourite quote from the presentation was:

"There are two disadvantages of global language arrangements: one of them is not knowing English; and the other one is knowing *only* English"

The students also took part in a campus tour and treasure hunt lead by current students during which they learned about university life, and what studying a language at university is like.

In the afternoon, students attended language workshops in Italian, German, Russian, and Mandarin Chinese. During these sessions students learned how to introduce themselves and ask others for basic details in their new language. It was brilliant to see all students taking part and throwing themselves into the opportunity to learn a new language, and all left the campus feeling inspired and lucky to be studying languages at school.

Thank you to Bath University for hosting this event and well done to all the Year 7s who took part- keep up the language learning!

Athletics - Dylan wins English Schools Championship and becomes no. 1 in UK

Following on from his fantastic success this year in athletics, having already competed at Loughborough and Chelmsford, we would like to congratulate Dylan Stoneman, a Lower Sixth student, who competed on behalf of Avon Schools in the English Schools Track and Field Championships in Birmingham at the weekend.

Dylan won the gold medal in the Senior Boys 2000m Steeplechase, with a finishing time of 6:02.29, and a new personal best by over 7 seconds. If this was not an achievement in itself, Dylan had to move up this season to compete in the U20M category, where his new time will move him up to #1 in the UK Athletics rankings for this event (he was previously #3).

Last Friday each Lower School Year had a 'Testimony Assembly'. Year 12's from the Mental Wellbeing Team shared anonymous testimonies from lower school students, as well as sharing their own. The testimony's shared honest accounts of their challenges with their emotional wellbeing and what they did to seek support and overcome

The sixth formers also spent some time normalising the way that our brain can cause us to overthink and how we can retrain our brain with some Solution Focused thinking.

They also shared a wonderful clip of Lewis Capaldi performing at Glastonbury Festival 2023. Where he had difficulty performing due to his Tourette's and how the audience supported him through. Highlighting how each of us can support each other through challenges.

In each assembly you could hear a pin drop. They were so moving and powerful. We are so very proud of all of the students.

This Friday teaching staff and the school's Solution Focused Practitioners will be delivering a workshop at the UKASFP (UK Association of Solution Focused Practitioners)

Conference in Oxford. The school have been invited to share their story of how they have imbedded the Solution Focused Approach across the school and how it may be applied in other schools across the Country.

Coaching skills for Parents Course

Have you had a conversation with your son or daughter that you would have liked to have ended differently?



Having a coaching approach can open up a conversation and elicit a response

which will give insights. It promotes self reflection and self awareness. A coaching style allows you to support decision making as your young person becomes increasingly independent and heads towards adulthood.

Do I need a whistle and trainers?

No, this is not sports coaching. Our focus will be on listening skills and asking effective questions which promote exploration of a topic and clarity of mind to allow for decision making.

Is this a parenting course by another name?

No. Coaching is used in many sectors including business, education and self improvement. The ethos of coaching is that the person doing the thinking is robust enough to make progress and that the coach will listen and ask questions in order to support that thinking. This is not a parenting course but it can ease family life and allow for better conversations with your offspring.

- * This is a 9 hour course delivered in two sessions. 9.00am 1.30 pm.
- * It will take place in person, in Bath.
- * There is a maximum of 24 places available on each course.
- * There are three courses available this summer each taking place on two consecutive Saturday mornings.
