Today has seen the publication of the provisional KS4 performance tables for 2023.

We were delighted with the achievements of our pupils in their examinations last summer and this is reflected in these tables.

The school's Progress 8 score is +0.49, which is well above the national average for England (-0.03) and the average for the Local Authority (+0.26).




Most pleasing is the fact that progress scores are well above national average for all ability bands.

In terms of attainment, the percentage of pupils achieving Grade 5 and above in English and Maths at GCSE was 66% and the average Attainment 8 score was 55.9. Both these figures are also well above the Local Authority average and the national average.

Year 11 Mock examinations

After completing the first part of their GCSE's over the last year, pupils in Year 11 will be taking their first round of Mock Examinations next term from Friday 10th to Friday 17th November. These are a vital step in the process of preparing them to take their formal Examinations in the summer and will provide a useful experience of completing examinations in a formal setting, as well as giving them a timely update on how they are progressing in each subject.

These Examinations will take place in the Sports Hall and the Library. In addition to these, there will be a few listening examinations for English and the Languages taking place in lessons during the week of 6th November. I would kindly ask all pupils and students to show due respect to the Year 11 pupils by moving silently around these areas whilst Examinations are taking place.

In order to support the Year 11 pupils in revising for these Mock Examinations, we provided Year 11 pupils with a GCSE revision workshop on the afternoon of Tuesday 17th October, and have published a list of Personalised Learning Checklists (PLCs) detailing what pupils need to cover and how they can best revise for each paper. 












Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge

The Eco Group have reassembled this term with the aim to reduce plastic waste and to lower the school's energy and gas consumption through various means. Changes have already been put in place around the school to lower our consumption of electricity and to lower our carbon footprint:

- Joining Energy Sparks to be able to track our energy consumption
- A vegetarian day once a week to help limit meat consumption
- Installation of solar panels on the main building roof to provide renewable electricity
- Installation of LED lighting around the school site
- Computers automatically shutting down at 5.30pm

The group will also be conducting litter picks around the local community and encouraging the use of less gas in heating - a one degree decrease can save up to £1000 a year!

Combined Cadet Force (CCF) - Term Review

The first term of 2023-24 has been particularly busy; inducting our new cadets, completing the assessment of new NCOs and taking our entire contingent away on Exercise First Chance. With much more to come in the next few months it promises to be a fairly enriching experience for everyone involved.

At the end of August eight Year 10 cadets undertook the intensive MOI (Method of Instruction) training, a programme preparing and assessing them for the teaching of the broad cadet syllabus. This is always a very challenging but rewarding part of CCF life and we were all delighted to see that every participant passed, allowing them to receive the rank of Lance Corporal and to be qualified to take on the teaching of the younger recruits.

In early September the new recruits joined the contingent, bringing more than fifty Year 9 cadets into King Edward's CCF and providing a logistical challenge, each of them requiring a full 'kit out' of uniform, webbing, bergan (rucksack), sleeping bag, mess tins, roll mat and basha sheet. The aim was to issue them with everything needed for the first exercise away in the field - Exercise First Chance.

This exercise took place at Merryfield Royal Navy Air
Base in Somerset, giving the more than one hundred
cadets attending an opportunity to either teach or learn new
skills. The new Beechen Cliff recruits were then able to
create their own shelters, cook army rations for themselves
and participate in some exciting night time navigation
exercises within their sections. Two days of training,
provided by the senior cadets, ensured they were in a
position to pass their assessments and take the first big step
to winning their berets. In addition to building their CCF
skill portfolio the boys have been gathering evidence for the
Duke of Edinburgh Awards, the 'volunteering' and 'skills' elements
of cadet service fitting well with the programme.

We look ahead now to the Remembrance Day events, the Annual Dinner Night, Christmas Fun Night and the start, for the Year 9 cadets at least, of the weapon training that will see them take the experience at the next trip away, Exercise Next Step, to a new level.

Year 9 Surfing Trip to Kernow

On Sunday 15th October, 20 Year 9 students embarked on their journey to Trevose Head, Cornwall, for a 3 day surfing trip. Staying at Treyarnon YHA, meant that the group were within easy reach of one of the country's best surfing beaches and in close proximity to Padstow.

The staff and other guests at the YHA were very complimentary of our boys with their polite manners and respect for others, and they were particularly blown away by our 'we were never here' approach after our all breakfast and dinner sessions.



Due to the sea conditions, the boys were able to undertake two surfing sessions under the watchful eye of the staff at Harlyn Surf School, before exploring the rocks and swells through the activity of coasteering, where "we are learning geography in real life" was heard. These activities tested the boys' resilience and enabled some of them to overcome their fears as they jumped off cliff tops into the various pools and rock clearings in the sea.

Evenings were spent visiting Padstow and sampling Rick Stein's renown chips and playing ball games on the beach at Trevose Head. Watching the quarter final World Cup matches on a large screen and participating in a movie night







As part of our return journey, the boys once again got the opportunity to wrestle with neoprene, as they kitted themselves up for the FlowRider, an artificial wave on which tricks could be performed whilst on body boards and miniature surfboards







The group were great company throughout, and took full advantage of the opportunities presented, hence were a pleasure to spend time with.

LIBRARY NEWS

PLEASE CHECK FOR OVERDUE BOOKS!





The Accelerated Reader (AR) system Accelerated is a useful motivational tool which we use in Year 7 and Year 8 at Beechen use in Year 7 and Year 8 at Beechen (alongside the planners) to keep track

of the boys' reading habits. All Y7 and Y8 boys should now have their logins and passwords stuck in the back of their planners. AR is accessed from the student intranet:

https://global-zone61.renaissance-go.com/ welcomeportal/2231719

Best practice is that pupils should 'quiz' on a book within 48 hours of finishing it, so that the system is recording current reading and not just testing memory. AR counts the words read and we award certificates to boys who have read 100,000, 250,000, 500,000 and one million words. So far, we have allowed boys to quiz on any book they have read since September due to some classes not getting their log ins until later in the term but we are monitoring pupils' progress to ensure they are using the system properly and fairly. 42 boys will be receiving their 100,000 word certificates this week. Well done!




