If appropriate, we will signpost the best entries to national competitions which they could enter.

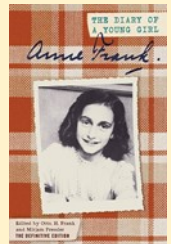

Beechen Cliff School – Solution Focused Therapeutic Provision 2022/23 Academic Year



Next Thursday 16th November, Tara Gretton and Susie Ingram will be running a free online Parent/Carer Training session at 6:00pm-7:00pm, to share some information on the wellbeing provision at Beechen Cliff and about the use of the Solution Focused Approach in their 1:1 and Group therapeutic provision and across the whole school. For parents and carers, learning how to have a solution-focused conversation with your children is an amazing tool and matches the approach we are using in school too.

Interesting Data

We wanted to share with you some interesting data about the numbers of students who received 1:1 support during the last academic year and the sorts of topics young people were struggling with.

During 2022/23 Academic year, Tara and Susie saw a total of 121 students across the whole school for 1:1 Solution Focused therapy. This represents 9.5% of all students in the school.

In total, Tara and Susie delivered 1,072 1:1 therapy sessions over 35 weeks of the academic year. On average, students had 9 sessions each.

Sixth Form

Due to the therapy Tara Gretton has been providing to the boys in the Lower School over the past 5 years, we are now seeing fewer internal boys seeking support when they are in the Sixth Form. This is extremely pleasing and very much part of our preventative mental health strategy.

Students have been accessing support for a whole range of issues, but the following table gives a flavour of what many students have been struggling with.

Anxiety	Low Mood and Depression
Feeling self-conscious	Fear of being judged
Social Anxiety	Unhealthy relationship with food
Body Image	Coping with 'banter'
Friendship dynamics	Coping with stress and pressure of exams/ revision
Trust Issues	Family dynamics

Fear of feeling sick	Panic Attacks
Overthinking and intrusive thoughts	Grief and loss
Impact of Covid and Lockdown	Worrying about the future

Tara (Years 7-11) and Susie (Sixth Form) are already working with 80 individual students across all year groups this academic year and group work is happening alongside this. 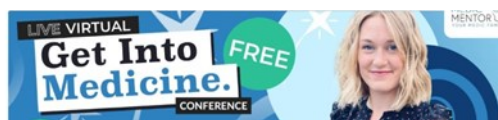
