We are really grateful for members of our Parent Teacher Association who are incredibly supportive of the whole school and who have raised tens of thousands of pounds over the last few years to support a variety of projects that otherwise would not have been possible.

Money raised has funded the clubhouse by the tennis courts, support to build up mental health and wellbeing services, renovation of the school library, lots of different extra-curricular clubs including debating, lego robotics, foreign film club and sports, 3D Printers for DT and new digital screens in Maths and English classrooms.

Funds have been raised through crowdfunding, raffles, quiz nights, an auction of promises, the Christmas market, second hand uniform sales and running a bar at school events.

In addition, the second hand uniform sales play an important role in the recycling of uniform and ensuring access to pre-loved uniform at a reduced cost.

We have reached a stage where many of those who have volunteered for many years are moving on and we are looking for both new recruits and new leadership of our PTA to ensure this support is able to continue and for the benefit of our pupils in school.

Our current members would be delighted to meet you and please be assured that you can give as much or as little time as you have.



- the balance of the ingredients used in the recipe
- the skills required to create the dish
- the use of ingredients produced locally to you or from the wider South West region wherever possible.
- Final dish including presentation.

Parent Survey - Highlights and Feedback

Following the recent Parent Survey (181 responses), we would like to provide some feedback to parents. Please see the salient results, some strengths and areas for us to look at moving forward.

- 97% agree that we have a clear vision for our pupils and we encourage them to embrace the Core Values of Aspiration, Compassion, Independence and Respect
- 86% agree that we develop pupil's character
- 93% agree that their child feels safe and is happy in school
- 84% agree that the school promotes and supports good mental health and well-being for our pupils and that we encourage pupils to consider others and to make positive contributions to the lives of those around them.
- 85% agree that the school encourages positive relationships, respect and tolerance amongst all members of the school community.
- 98% agree that the school encourages good attendance for all pupils
- 85% agree that Beechen Cliff promotes good behaviour amongst its pupils and 91% agree that we have high expectations of pupils with the same number agreeing that their child does well at Beechen Cliff.
- 90% of parents are aware of the extra curricular activities on offer at school with 84% taking part in these activities in school and another 84% taking part in activities outside of school

There is also strong agreement that you feel welcomed when you visit school and that you can contact staff when you need to and find them friendly and approachable.

We will be working on the following:

- Continued focus on high expectations, respect and wellbeing to ensure all pupils feel safe and happy in school.
- Ensuring timely responses to parent queries within 48 hours (working days() wherever possible.
- Providing further support in helping your child's learning (in addition to the Parent Information Evenings for every year group in September and October)
- Making parents more aware of how to see what their child is learning by directing them to curriculum booklets on the school website with more regular communication on this.
- Some parents are frustrated with dealing with several IT platforms. Streamlining will take place where possible including linking Google Classroom to Talaxy.
- Encouraging and supporting even greater participation in extra-curricular activities.
- Considering the format of Parents Evenings
- Considering forms of communication to reduce the number of parents who respond 'don't know' to survey questions.

We are really appreciative of the feedback. It will feed into school improvement planning.

Supporting From Home – using the Solution Focused Approach

We are constantly looking to engage with parents and support them to support their child at home. One recent initiative is explained below. Whilst this initiative was designed to offer bespoke training for parents of pupils who are neurodiverse, the training is extremely helpful for all parents/carers who are curious to learn about how to have a Solution Focused conversation with their children.

Solution Focused Therapy and Neurodiversity

In November 2023, Jo Blair (SENDCo) and Tara Gretton (Solution Focused Therapist) delivered bespoke training for parents/carers of pupils who are neurodiverse, helping parents to consider how they might use the principles of Solution Focused Therapy to support positive, curious and purposeful communication at home.



Tara and Jo were delighted at how well received the session was and how enthusiastic parents were. For so many parents, life with teenagers can be challenging, for parents of pupils who are neurodiverse these challenges can be more pronounced. It was great to come together and consider how making some small changes at home using this approach can help pupils and families focus on positive change and avoid getting caught in the cycle of dreaded future and troubled past.
