We have set this homework for a number of reasons, detailed below. Encourage your son to complete this homework and talk to him about his choice

Encouraging boys to read.

New Year, New Habits

Encourage your son to set an alarm to remind him to do a few minutes reading each day. This could be before or after dinner, at bedtime or just a few minutes after school. Building up a habit takes time, but in a week, it should start to become easier. For avid readers, it can be a nice way to remember to relax after a busy day. Don't forget to record reading in planners so you can celebrate progress.

Frequently Asked Questions

I don't like reading books. Do I need to do this?

Yes! This is the perfect opportunity to start a reading habit that will last a lifetime. You can get support from the librarians in school.

I've got lots of books at home. Do I need to get a book out of the library?

Yes! Being able to use a library and access information is a life skill that will be important to you as you move forward. After COVID, the number of books being borrowed from libraries has dramatically reduced. But borrowing books is FREE and you might find something new. **I already read every day. Do I need to do this?**

Yes! Be an ambassador for reading in the school. You could recommend a good book to a pupil who doesn't like reading yet.

Tir Y Cwm updates

The school and staff frequently this this venue throughout the year and 2023 was certainly a significant year for upgrades and improvements.

In February last year the kitchen and bathroom were replaced and upgraded. However ongoing issues were faced with energy generation due to unreliable generators.

This problem has been addressed and during the short, dark days of December a new off grid system involving solar panels and battery storage was installed. It is hoped that this will reduce the need to use diesel generators and be a quieter and greener solution to meeting energy demands at Tir Y Cwm, which as some of you know, is well off the beaten track.



The project was done by Off Grid Installers whose work is usually done on remote Caribbean islands. Much thanks must go to Leigh Naylor and his team who have been fastidious in their attention to detail and clear enjoyment of the job.

Already it has proven its worth with a constant supply of power that is topped up the next day as long as it gets light...sunshine is a rarity in this part of Wales. Several groups should benefit from this when Ten Tors training in the coming month. This includes Beechen Cliff pupils, Sexeys School, Bruton and Bristol Grammar School.

Attention now turns to finding/raising funds to upgrade the external bunkhouse facilities.

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you are managing well in the cold January weather.

Something that comes up a lot in our conversations with the students is sleep. Sleep can be a real issue for young people especially as the sleep hormone melatonin is released later at night for young people than it is for adults, which can make going to sleep harder. And they have the distraction of mobile phones.

Something that we have been talking to students about is how they can set their own best hopes around their sleep and can learn about small ways to support this healthy change.

Sleep is not just important for our physical health but for our mental and emotional health too. The brain can literally re-wire negative memories when we sleep.
