Year 11 pupils embark on their second set of mock exams next week and the following week Year 13 students will also have their mock exams. These assessments will provide another useful update on attainment and progress before the final 'run-in' to the summer exams. We wish all students all the best for the busy weeks ahead.

Our assemblies and tutor time themes this week have been based on acts of kindness and we have also been fortunate to have a visiting speaker from Julian House to talk to pupils in Year 8 and 9 about their work in the city.

In sport this week Bath Rugby claimed their first ever Premiership Rugby U18 Academy League title with a 34-33 victory over Northampton Saints. Many Beechen Cliff students were part of this team, which secured this title for the first time; a fantastic achievement. In addition our Beechen Cliff U15 Rugby team are preparing for the Continental Tyres Schools National Vase Semi Final against St Albans on Sunday 3rd March at Aylesbury Rugby Club and our first XI football team also progressed to the semi finals of the Somerset Cup with a 4-3 victory over Chew Valley School.

Two upcoming events to put in the diary are our annual school concert, which is taking place at St Luke's Church on 21st March, and our school production of West Side Story which is taking place from 25th to 28th March. World Book Day: Thursday 7th March





We invite donations (via ParentPay) to support literacy development in school. This includes reading resources across the curriculum, author visits and other resources.


There will also be a book sale where pupils can buy ex-library books for 20p.


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Reading Homework

USA Ski Trip 2025



As part of this course they have successfully stripped and rebuilt a pair of GoKarts and have also been training at Teamsport, Avonmouth with us to enter the British Indoor Karting Championships (BIKC) 2024.

Each visit to the Karting centre involves a safety briefing and two 15-minute races where their performances are recorded to measure their Best Lap times, number of laps completed and any incidents they may be involved in on the track.



Our Beechen Cliff students compete against other Wheels students every week and are performing very well indeed improving their Best lap times with regular Personal Bests. They are also improving their control with fewer incidents and more laps completed each race. Three of the school's drivers have regularly finished in the top 4 places in recent weeks. Their attendance levels throughout their time at Wheels has been very high and their behaviours, attitudes and commitment to all of the activities has been exemplary throughout.



Empowering Students and all School Staff through Solution Focused Training

This week, our school community had the opportunity to engage in more solution focused training sessions with our solution focused practitioner Tara Gretton. Where 12 members of our dedicated staff gained invaluable skills and insights to co-empower our students and support their own emotional wellbeing.

One of the key takeaways from the training was the power of focusing on tiny preferred futures with our students. So, focusing on the presence of what is wanted, rather than focusing on the absence of what is not wanted. This is done by inviting them to envision what better looks like (their Best Hopes). By doing this we are co-creating wanted change together with them and empowering them to be agents of their own change for their own lives. Rather than imposing our adult solutions, we are fostering an environment where students are encouraged to articulate what they wish to see be better, and work collaboratively towards their desired change.

Equally important was the emphasis on using the solution focused approach to support staffs own emotional wellbeing. It can be all too easy to focus on what we haven't accomplished or where we have fallen short in the day. In the training, we encouraged staff to take a moment to acknowledge and appreciate themselves (what they were pleased to notice about themselves that day and how they had managed to get through the day), no matter how small. By shifting the focus to self-compassion and by focusing on what we are going that's working, we enhance our overall wellbeing.

Through solution focused approaches, we are not only empowering our students but we are also supporting our staff in fostering a culture of self-care and personal growth.

If you were to take a moment to think about what's gone well, what would you notice and what difference would it make to you to focus on what you have done, rather than on what you haven't done?




