The B&NES Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP) are running a series of knife crime awareness events throughout February and March.

These events will take place in schools across the area. The first event will be held at Writhlington School on February 22nd (17.30 to 19.30), followed by Hayesfield Girls School on February 29th (18.00 to 20.00) and Cameley CEVC Primary School on March 18th (18.00 to 20.00).

The events are aimed at parents and carers who would like to know more about the dangers of knife crime or are concerned that their children are at risk. They aim to increase awareness of key issues surrounding knife crime, empowering you and your children to make informed and positive decisions to stay safe.

You will have the opportunity to hear from guest speakers with lived experience who have been personally affected by knife crime. There will also be a presentation by Street Doctors followed by a panel discussion with the opportunity to ask questions.

Author Visit: A.F. Steadman



Last Thursday, we were delighted to welcome author A.F. Steadman to Beechen Cliff. A.F. Steadman spoke to a packed sports hall full of our Y7 boys and Y5 and Y6 pupils from St Philips and Oldfield Park Junior School. There was a lovely buzz in the air as the primary school children arrived and the excitement continued when A.F. Steadman introduced herself and her brilliant series of books about Skandar and his adventures with bloodthirsty, magical unicorns.

We found out about the author's journey from training to be a lawyer to writing books and she read out extracts from her novels. We then worked together to create a new unicorn character which A.F. Steadman said might appear in one of her future books. Look out for Blood Blast, the red air-element unicorn, ridden by his rider, Lucas. Lucas was delighted that his name was voted the best, especially as he has already read both the Skandar books!



A.F. Steadman also found time to drop in to our Upper 6th English Literature Class where they grilled her with questions about her time at Cambridge University. They were interested to learn that she was supported financially by a scholarship and that she had studied both law and languages. They also talked about the process of writing and publication and feedback from the students suggested that this session had been really useful and eye-opening. A fabulous experience for all involved.

BEECHEN CLIFF THREE PEAKS CHALLENGE



FRIDAY 28TH JUNE TO MONDAY 1ST JULY

The Beechen Cliff Three Peaks Challenge is one of the many endurance challenges offered to students. It involves the ascent of the three highest mountains in Scotland, Wales and England, without undue stopping for rest or sustenance. The Challenge, taking place over a three and a half day period will include one days travel to the first mountain and half a day from the last mountain to home, driving 1200 miles, ascending over 3000 metres and walking a distance walked exceeding an Olympic marathon.

Whilst it is a challenge that will test the 'metal' of all participants, it is a group activity and team work is vital if the challenge is to be completed in the true spirit of adventure. Beechen Cliff still remains one of the few schools in the United Kingdom to undertake such an arduous challenge. This is possible as we have the expertise and experience in successfully organising this type of activity and we have a dedicated team willing literally to go the extra mile. This challenge is as always an awesome and unforgettable adventure.

There is a maximum of 28 places available, so please complete the form as soon as you can. Further information and a kit list are available from Mr Brewer in Humanities. The total cost for the adventure is **£395**.

This challenge is only open to years 10, 11 and the sixth form.

Access to pay the **£100 deposit** via ParentPay will be given after the form has been completed. This will finally secure your place. The remaining **£295** balance will need to be paid before **Friday 24th May 2024 to enable us to book and secure** all necessary accommodation before the event.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about MONKEY

Also known as Monkey Cool, this platform aims to fill the gap left by Omegle (which has now shut down) by placing users in random video chats with strangers. Participants use their mobile number and Snapchat username to connect to the service, where they can make matches, message other people and join group chats. The mobile version has been removed from the App Store due to safety concerns, but iPhone owners can still access the site via their web browser. The app remains available on Google Play, where its listing claims that Monkey has more than 30 million users worldwide.

AGE RESTRICTION
17+

(Although the lack of age verification means that someone younger could easily log in with a false date of birth)

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

The app claims to use AI to detect sexual content or activity that violates its policies, along with having a 24/7 moderation team. However, reports in the media continue to indicate that explicit content remains commonplace on Monkey (including sexually graphic or violent material) and is therefore accessible to anybody who uses the app – including those aged under 18.



CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

The obvious risk in accepting random video chat partners is that users cannot know what or who they will see on their next connection. Talking to strangers is, of course, potentially dangerous – especially for children who might be persuaded to meet up with these people offline. The app lets users find each other by location, increasing the chances of a child being matched with a stranger from their local area.



IN-APP SPENDING

While Monkey is free to download, it nevertheless offers in-app purchases promising to unlock access to premium features. For example, users who wish to make use of 'Knock Knock chat' (Monkey's text-based messaging option), rather than the app's Chatroulette-style random video calling feature, will need to pay to be able to do so.



INTRUSIONS ON PRIVACY

According to Monkey's privacy policy, personal information (such as name, profile picture and date of birth), user-contributed content (any photos, texts, videos and screenshots shared) and each user's browser and IP address are collected. That is a considerable amount of data for Monkey to gather on its users – and all of this information is shared with third parties.



Advice for Parents & Carers

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

Even if you're comfortable with your child using Monkey, it's still important to talk about the potential dangers. It's crucial, for instance, that young people recognise the risks that stem from video chatting with strangers; that they understand not to share identifying information (like their street or school name); and that they know what to do if they are exposed to inappropriate content.



RESTRICT IN-APP PURCHASING

If your child is accessing Monkey via an Android device, you can prevent them from making in-app purchases through the device's settings. If you do allow your child to use the site, we'd recommend that you enable this feature: young people have been known to spend significant amounts of money in their desire to unlock more features in apps such as this.



REPORT INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Monkey states in the safety section of its site that "people are given the power" and that, to a large extent, Monkey is "self-governing." If a user is exposed to sexually explicit or inappropriate content on the platform, they can select the 'police' emoji in the top right corner of their screen to submit a report for Monkey's moderation team to review.



SPOT THE SIGNS

If you're concerned that your child is spending too much time on Monkey – or that they may have been exposed to inappropriate or distressing content – it's important to watch for potential indications that they've been affected emotionally. They could be unusually irritable or unable to concentrate, for example, or failing to complete their homework or even to eat regular meals.



Meet Our Expert

Dr Claire Sutherland is an online safety consultant, educator and researcher who has developed and implemented anti-bullying and cyber safety policies for schools. She has written various academic papers and carried out research for the Australian government comparing internet use and sexting behaviour of young people in the UK, USA and Australia.

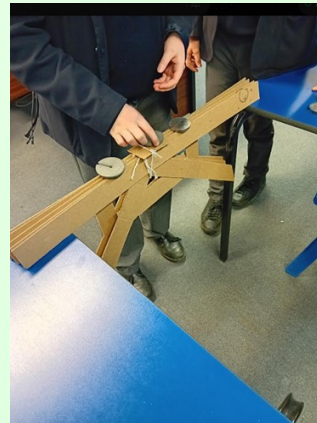

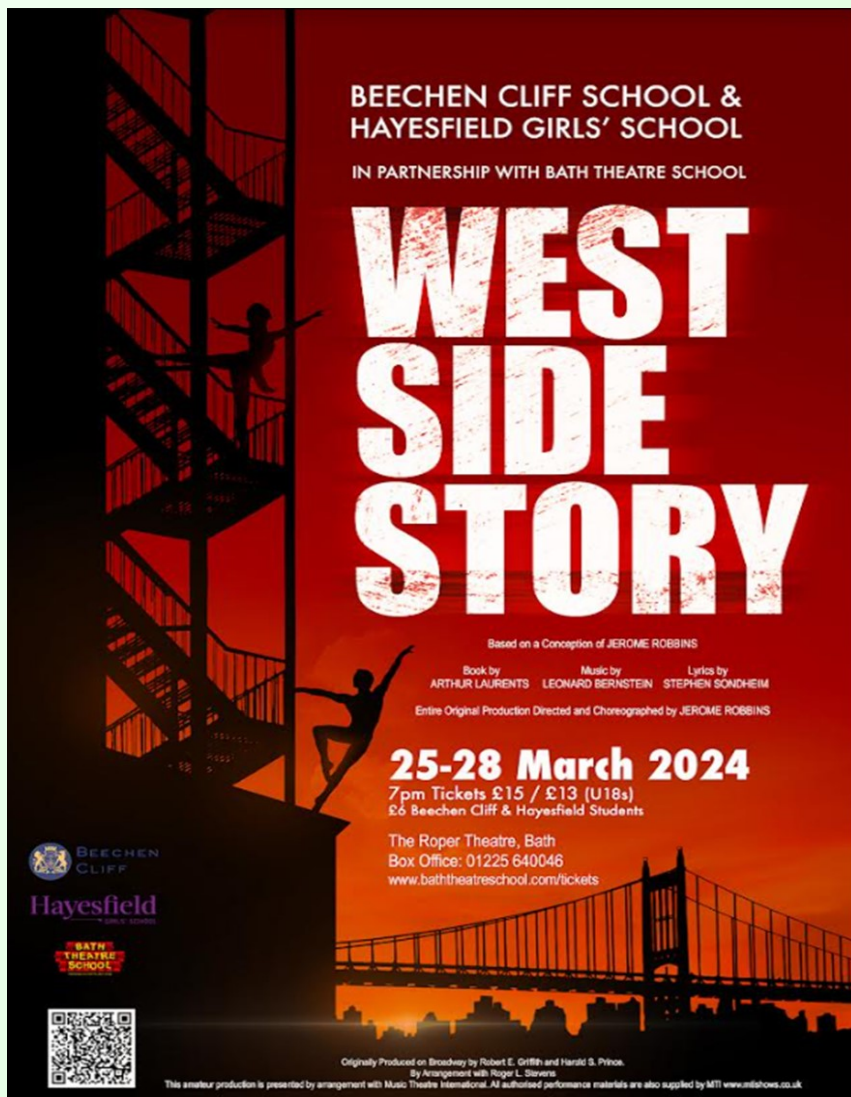


Blue Stockings starring Rory McDonald

Routes into STEM is an experience that provides an amazing opportunity to help students understand the different routes to further STEM education and career pathways.

Who is it for?

Students in Year 9 and 10 who are interested in finding out more about STEM careers. Students should also be within one-hour of travel distance of locations.

What is involved?

- A three-day local experience that includes a day in a university and two days at STEM companies local to them
- Students will explore STEM careers, participate in interactive workshops, site tours and hear from young professionals

What are the outcomes?

- Gain first-hand information and experience hands on activities at STEM educational providers and companies to make informed decisions about their future
- Go on campus tours and get thinking about future studies in a mature and informed manner
- Speak with apprentices/graduates about their experiences
- Develop valuable skills such as presentation skills, team-building, and social skills, and see how they can be applied to their CV, Application Form or Personal Statement
- Become a Bronze Industrial Cadet
