End of Year Exams

Now that we have reached the summer term, having spent the year so far learning new content and skills, we are approaching the End of Year Exams and I wanted to remind you of the arrangements for these so that you are aware of what is coming up and how you can help and support your child to achieve their full potential in these.

When are the End of Year Exams?

Year 7 - During the week commencing 13th May.

Year 8 - During the week commencing 20th May.

Year 9 - During the weeks commencing 3rd and 10th June.

Year 10 - During the week commencing 17th June.

Format of End of Year Exams

Exams in Years 7-9 will all take place during normal lessons and will last approximately 40-45 minutes (those allocated extra time will be able to use this during the lesson). For pupils in Year 10, some Exams will take place in the Sports Hall using full exam papers and external invigilators whilst others will take place in normal lessons. More details as to exactly when each exam will be shared in the coming days.

What content will the Exams cover?

Teachers will share personalised learning checklists (PLC's) on google classrooms which will detail the content that will be assessed in each Exam as well as suggested revision websites and activities.

Homework

Each year group will have a revision fortnight prior to their Exam week where no additional homework will be set (unless for revision) allowing them to use the time to prepare for the exams.

I wish all of our pupils the very best in the build up to these exams and hope that they achieve their full potential. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

Pupil Librarians. Our pupil librarians have worked really hard learning the ropes in the library and our first cohort of pupils earned their librarian badges recently.




Well done to Cooper H. and Tomas A. in Year 8 and Noah W. Rexon

- * Dyslexia-friendly versions of set texts for KS3/4 English (these are exactly the same as originals, but using special fonts, wide spacing and tinted paper).
- * 20+ recommended reads for teens with higher reading ages (thanks to Mr B's Emporium for the discounted books!). These books cover a range of themes and titles that pupils have requested or recommended over recent months, as well as books that regularly appear on 'must read' lists for teenage boys.
- * Teacher access to Twinkl, which has fantastic resources to support learners in many of the key subject areas across KS3 and KS4. As a join-up bonus, Twinkl gave us a complete set of reading scheme books to help EAL pupils learn phonics.





- * Shopping Baskets. Each tutor group will now have their tutor-room books in a handy and stylish shopping basket! These will be easier to store and move and make picking books easier.
- * Display Resources. As we continue to improve the library environment, we have purchased several new display boards and clip frames.

Dear Parents and Carers,

We wanted to share with you that over the past six months we have been introducing Group Work sessions across Year 7 to 10.

Our Best Hopes were to provide an opportunity for the students to have facilitated peer to peer conversations about wellbeing generally and their wellbeing best hopes for themselves at school. Our Best Hopes were also to create a space where talking about our emotional wellbeing could be normalised and that the students could also talk about small steps that they could take to improving their emotional wellbeing, whilst amplifying the ways that they cope and mange already.

We have been really fortunate to have the PTA purchase a Solution Focused Game for us and we have been using this in all of the group sessions.

Beechen Cliff was the first school in the UK to play the game! Which has been a very exciting aspect to the group work!

The Mindsetter Game was designed by Tara Gretton's friend; Occupational Therapist and solution focused practitioner Gesa Doringer in Amsterdam. The Mindsetter Game© is an innovative Solution Focused intervention developed with the objective to apply the SF approach in therapy or coaching and teach it in workshops and training. The Mindsetter is literally holding space for clients and their desired future. And it has proven to be effective to set the stage for new ideas and first steps towards the outcome a client is hoping for.

The feedback from the students has been really positive so far! We plan to carry out some qualitative research soon on the Solution Focused group work, which we will share with you when it is complete!


