Further to the upcoming Knife Awareness Week (Op Sceptre - 19th to 23rd May), the B&NES Violence Reduction Partnership have prepared a survey for children and young adults in B&NES to gather their thoughts and views on the very worrying issue of knife crime and the effect it has on them.

I have mentioned before the 2009 University of Sussex study that showed reading stories for just six minutes a day can reduce stress rates by 60%. The concentration you need to read a good book means your brain hasn't got space to be anxious and think about stressful things. This in turn reduces heart rate and muscle tension caused by stress. Don't forget this if exam stress hits!


### Jurassic World: Rebirth Poster Competition

The Finance Office will then grant access to the ParentPay account enabling you to pay the £100 Entrance Fee and Secure your place. Entrees will capped this year at 100 and entry will close 4 weeks before the event (Monday the 2nd of June) - so you need to secure your place!

In the event the Challenge is greatly oversubscribed then places will be allocated fairly across the year groups and some places will be allocated to Pupil Premium / Sixth Form Bursary students.





