A Level Examination Success

Beechen Cliff students have been celebrating another fantastic set of A Level results this summer.

At A Level 29% of grades achieved were A*/A grades, 65% were at A*-B and 88% of grades were at A*- C, well above the national average for England this year. Students studying vocational courses also achieved excellent results with an average grade of a Distinction.

90% of our Year 13 students are about to embark on their next steps at university. This means that over 180 students are now going to take up places at their chosen universities with 82% of these achieving their first choice course. Some highlights include students achieving places at Oxford University to study Geography, Cambridge University to study Law, and four Medicine places at Bristol, Exeter and Newcastle. Other exciting destinations include Exeter, Imperial College London, London School of Economics, Durham and Edinburgh.


Other students are moving onto Art Foundation courses, apprenticeships and degree apprenticeships, the armed forces, professional sporting contracts, employment or gap years.
