Welcome Back

Curriculum Information

In order to help everyone be as prepared as possible in their studies, please note that we have updated the subject curriculum booklets and learning journeys for each subject on the school website. Homework information

Now that students have had their first few lessons, they will have begun to receive some homework. All homework is set on Google Classroom. The work will include instructions and any documents required will also be attached. The due date is included and work which is due will show in students' "to do" list. We ask that students also record their homework in their planner so that they and you are able to easily see what is due and to develop their independence.

Google Classroom summary emails

To help you to keep track of the homework your child has been set, you will be invited as a guardian to their Google Classroom. Once you have received an email inviting you to join the Google Classroom, you will start to receive weekly summary emails which will show all of the homework your child has been set. You can alter the frequency of these emails in the settings. We are still currently in the process of inviting guardians as we were delayed by network difficulties in the last week of summer. However, we have now resolved the issues and expect that you will receive the invitation email in the coming days. Please look out for these. Combined Cadet Force New Academic Year Update

Whilst most members of the school community have been enjoying the break, for many of the cadets and staff the holiday has provided the opportunity to prepare aspiring young leaders within the contingent and to plan for the year ahead.

The first job of the summer break was to put together the kit and uniform packs to ensure that the fifty new recruits in Year 9 are fully equipped to take on the roles and to undertake the training which will be the mainstay of the first two terms in the contingent. Packing the bergans (rucksacks) with a sleeping bag, liner, mess tins, webbing, fleece and waterproofs took a great deal of time but it is always worth the effort when the new cadets get to receive their packs and recognise for the first time the investment in time and equipment that is being made for them.

From August 18th until August 28th the cadets in Year 10 who had put themselves forward to be considered for promotion attended the MOI (Method of Instruction) course which allows them to demonstrate their ability to teach lessons to the younger cadets and to show that they have the skills required to take on leadership within the contingent. It is a demanding experience and one from which all participants benefit. Each lesson being delivered (in fieldcraft, skill at arms, signals, drill or first aid) is assessed formally and, if every element is passed, allows the cadet to be considered for promotion to the rank of Lance Corporal and to be eligible to be fitted for the 'formal' uniform used on special occasions.

This year 21 candidates put themselves forward for the course and each acquitted him or herself exceptionally well. The 'middle' section of the course involves a three day 'residential' experience in the field - a rather generous description of an experience which involves sleeping under a piece of camouflaged sheet in a wood. It is this element which tests the cadets to remain positive and focused, despite the need to be 'on duty' for periods of the night and to be setting out and delivering fieldcraft lessons to their peers. They all returned fairly exhausted on the Sunday afternoon, despite the opportunity to stop at a Greggs en route for home.



As we look ahead to the next term and new academic year we will have a number of priorities to consider; integrating and equipping our large influx of new recruits, delivering our annual visit to Bovington Tank Museum, preparing for the first exercise away of the year and ensuring that the contingent is ready to do its duty at the annual Remembrance Sunday events in the city. Our contingent now numbers 130 cadets and is supported by eight staff, allowing the provision of a full range of opportunities - from shooting, archery, adventurous outdoor pursuits and skills in the field. We also provide a base for pupils who are working towards the Duke of Edinburgh Award to achieve various elements.

Tir y Cwm bunkhouse developments.



As we head towards this year's year 7 residentials at Tir y cwm, there have been some exciting developments over the summer, which hopefully our new cohort will enjoy for the first time.

With money raised from the Auction of promises and other funds, the external bunkhouse underwent a significant upgrade in the summer.

All the old squeaky and noisy bunks were removed and a new 'Alpine' bunk installed. Alpine bunks are used in mountain huts in the Alps and are essentially large platforms for communal sleeping.

There is also extra capacity for kit storage with these too.

The internal walls and roof have had new insulation fitted and the bunk room is certainly warmer as a result. As you will see from the photos, there is a significant painting job still to be done as well as some shelf fittings, but it is a significant improvement and use of space over the old bunks.

Many thanks have to go to Renway LTD based in Bradford on Avon who built the bunk and added the insulation. Hopefully this is an asset that will last many years.




