As a non-teaching Head of Futures and a Level 6 qualified Careers Adviser, with over 20 years of experience in private sector recruitment and both secondary and further education, I offer a well-rounded perspective on career development and guidance.

I joined Writhlington School in 2014 and in 2020, was seconded to work across several schools within the Midsomer Norton Schools Partnership Trust, including Beechen Cliff. For the last four years I have worked solely at Beechen Cliff School and am available on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays.

Last year we invested in Unifrog, an award-winning online platform that brings all careers, university, and apprenticeship information into one easy-to-navigate place. It will be used across all year groups -

- Years 7–8: Students explore interests, skills, and early career ideas using fun and interactive tools
- Year 9: As GCSE options approach, students access personality quizzes and subject guides to support informed decisions
- Year 10: Students begin building CVs, exploring careers in more depth, and preparing for work experience
- Year 11: Comprehensive tools to research sixth form, college, apprenticeships and T Levels; support with personal statements and applications
- Years 12–13: Full support for UCAS applications, super-curricular development, MOOCs, interview prep, job searches, and apprenticeship guidance.


