Breakfast and dinner

- Breakfast is available in the refectory from 7:30 8:15am
- Morning Briefing starts at 8.00am in the common room you are late after this. All to arrive ready for school.
- Dinner Time (evening briefing) starts at 5.45pm you are late after this.
- No phones at dinner.
- Wait until everyone on your table has finished.

Prep (lower school)

- Takes place in Sixth Form common room Monday -Thursday from 6:30pm until 7:45pm
- You should be completing work everyday.
- If the work you complete is not good enough, or not done, your teachers will inform the boarding house (everytime).
- Parents are informed (everytime).
- If this happens, additional support will be put in place.

Prep (Sixth Form)

For A Levels, 4 hours of study per subject outside of lessons. Teachers should help direct you.

For Level 3 - be proactive, ask your teachers what you can do to get ahead outside of lessons.

For sporting fixtures 'be ready' - what work are you going to miss? Can you ask for work to be put on GC?

Takes place in Sixth Form common room Tuesday - Thursday from 6:30pm until 7:45pm

Using the kitchen

- Ask the member of staff on duty to use the kitchen
- Leave the kitchen better than you found it 'show respect'.
- If everyone does this, it will not be an effort.
- Left fridge Boarding. Middle fridge Year 7-11.
 Right fridge Sixth Form
- Do not eat food that is not yours! Show respect
