Equipment and Uniform Expectations

It is the expectation that all pupils bring the required equipment to school each day so that they are ready for learning. As you will appreciate, with boys navigating the school and entering different classrooms for different lessons, settling down to their 'do now' task and being able to switch their focus from the previous subject to the current one at the start of each lesson can be challenging enough. The impact that 'I haven't got a pen/pencil/my book' can have significantly reduces the teachers ability to start lessons promptly, focus their attention on the students that require support or to maintain the momentum and pace to the challenge that is on offer to maximise learning.

You may, or hopefully not, have seen a rise in emails over this term with regards to our students being ready and equipped to learn each day. We have employed a monitoring system that requires every boy in Years 7 to 11 to have their

'learning equipment' checked by their tutors formally every Monday, but also to have these things out on their desks each day during tutor time and all lessons so that we can be assured that they will not lose any vital learning time seeking alternatives. The expectation is that they are able to fill the following equipment mat on a Monday, if not, it is likely that you will receive an email asking you to support your son in getting the equipment so that he can be successful.

In addition, we expect students to be smartly dressed in their school uniform at school as this not only fits with the ethos and values of the school but it also sets the tone for effective learning. No member of staff wants to be continually asking boys to tuck their shirt in or do up their top button, but we have high standards

of uniform and we don't apologise for these expectations. We have, this term, had a refocus on the basics and we would expect that all students are equipped to learn, dressed appropriately and behave accordingly.


Can I please ask that over half term you check to ensure your son has all the required equipment for school. In addition please can you check your son's shirts to ensure that they fit around the neck, that his tie is still looking the way it should, that he has school shoes, (trainers are not permitted) and that his blazer still fits as we expect these to be worn every day.

- Final dish including presentation


