These are a vital step in the process of preparing them to take their formal Examinations in the summer and will provide a useful experience of completing examinations in a formal setting, as well as giving them a timely update on how they are progressing in each subject. 

The assembly gave students the chance to reflect on the importance of Black History Month and learn about influential figures who have shaped history. Through discussions, videos, and interactive segments, students explored themes of equality, identity, and inclusion. Beechen Cliff received a shout out from the presenters live during the show and three Year 13 boys were beamed live to the nation!

Theme of the week this week is Black History Month.

What is Black History Month?

Black History Month started over a hundred years ago in the US, as a way to bring Black voices and stories to discussions of history. It was first recognised in the UK in the 1980s, organised in October by Akyaaba Addai-Sebo, to acknowledge 150 years of Caribbean freedom and the 100th birthday of Marcus Garvey.

Why do we celebrate it today?

We celebrate Black History Month because celebrating the achievements of people is important and Black History is still underrepresented in mainstream history classes and books. Throughout the 150-year history of the British Red Cross, we have had countless kind and resilient volunteers work with us at the British Red Cross. These people are recognised for their kindness. We celebrate Black History Month by highlighting and recognising the contributions of some Black British Humanitarians.

We had the first Student Solution Focused Training Session of the Academic Year last week!

Dear Parents and Carers,

We had the privilege of training some of our Year 13 sixth form students in the solution focused approach. It was a wonderful opportunity to explore the approach together, using the Mindsetter game to support and spark conversations.

The solution focused approach has a focus on -

What's wanted and what is already working in people's lives.

We hope that by learning about the solution focused approach, young people can discover the value of paying attention to what's wanted and what's already working well. This positive way of thinking can support them in their everyday lives and help shape how they see themselves and their future. We also hope they will use solution focused ideas to encourage and support younger students, as well as each other. Over time, they may even grow into ambassadors for the approach, sharing these skills widely and passing them on to the next generation of students.

When reflecting on their learning, the students shared some powerful takeaways:

- They could see how the solution focused approach can be used in everyday life and how that might make a real difference in how they cope and manage challenges.
- They recognised the sense of agency it gives them – being seen and valued as the experts in their own lives.
- They noticed how the approach could also help them support younger students in school, as well as their own friends and family.


A fantastic start to the year, with these young people already seeing how practical and impactful solution focused thinking can be.


