Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been an incredible week of sporting success.

Following the victory over Loughborough last week the ACE Rugby Team were presented with the league trophy. We were delighted to have representatives from the RFU, representatives from Bath Rugby including Head Coach Johann van Graan and both former and current staff involved with the rugby programme join the entire rugby squad for the presentations. It was a memorable occasion for all involved and great to see the trophy lifted at home at Beechen Cliff.



Also this week we have seen the 1st Tennis Team progress to the knockout stages of the national winter tennis competition with victory over Monkton Combe.

We have also seen great achievements in football with the U15s through to the next round of the Somerset Cup with a 13-12 penalty shoot out victory over Chilton Trinity, the U13s through to the last 32 of the National Cup with a 9-0 victory over Kingdown and the 1st XI through to the last 8 of the National Cup with a 3-1 victory over Marling.
