A formal presentation of the trophy will take place at school on Monday with representatives from the RFU and the Bath Head Coach Johann van Graan.
















Drama Showcase


Frosty mornings at Beechen Cliff

IGNITE DAY

Last Thursday, over 460 Year 7 students from the three Bath Hub schools (Beechen Cliff, Hayesfield and St Mark's) met at Beechen Cliff, to take part in a "Mission to Mars" programme of activities for Ignite Day.

Students collaborated with each other in four different sessions, each linked to an aspect of Space travel, and with a link to sustainable careers. In the "Launch" session, students designed rockets, taking into account the cost of materials, and sustainability of different fuels. In "The Search for Life" session, students learned about the work of astrobiologists, and carried out their own

investigation into sand samples (from three different locations on Mars!) for signs of life. This investigation involved observing the samples for a response to hydration, and testing them for the presence of different biological molecules.



In "The Habitation" session, students learned about the roles of space architects and material scientists, and tested different materials for their insulating properties. In a creative writing session, students met with acclaimed children's

author Emma Read to hear from her about what it is like to be an author, and how to start writing their own stories.



Students from the three schools worked in mixed groupings throughout the day, and it was wonderful to see the students so engaged in all of the activities. We hope that the year 7 students enjoyed the day, and came away from it having learned something new about Space, and with their horizons broadened regarding possible future careers.






