TEN TORS

Design & Technology

Over the past 6 months the D&T department has seen significant investment into Computer Aided Design & Manufacture facilities. This has enabled our students to really advance the quality of products they are designing and making. This has been seen through all key stages, however most notably in KS4 & KS5. The department would like to thank the PTA for their support in reaching our desire to ensure students are exposed to industrial standard systems and processes.

Below are examples of Y13 NEA outcomes and Y10 Lighting Module outcomes

A Level Product Design



A device to support people with cerebral palsy. The medical condition sometimes results in a limited range of movement and stiffness within the joints and muscles. The product was designed to increase prolonged periods of localised stretching. Manufactured by 3D Printing ABS, Laser Cutting and forming both GRP and latex cork.

A multi changeable desk design for students with autism and ADHD at Chew Magna Primary School. The design allows the user to stand whilst in use, but also the detachable top section allows use on a desk.




The product has been manufactured using CNC Routing, 3D printing and laser cutting. In addition, several traditional methods have been adopted in the manufacture.

A specialised bicycle storage rack to be used at the boarding house at BeechenCliff School. The design has taken influence from organic themes to fit in its environment. The product has been manufactured using lamination processes, 3D printing and traditional techniques such as welding and timber joining methods.



Year 10 Design & Technology - Task lighting Module

The Year 10 students have designed and manufactured task lighting for a specific client of their choice. The client has supported the design process as the students have developed their concepts. The final outcomes have been manufactured by laser cutting plywood, 3D printing and electronics.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back. We hope the school holidays offered some time to rest, reconnect, and enjoy moments together as a family. As we begin the new term, we wanted to share a few gentle reflections that sit alongside the solution focused way we support young people in school.

Research continues to show that everyday relationships matter. Young people benefit from feeling noticed, listened to, and supported by the adults around them, even as they grow in independence. Often it is the small, ordinary moments that make the biggest difference.

A solution focused perspective invites curiosity about what is already going well. Noticing effort, progress, and times when things feel a little easier can help young people build confidence and a sense of capability.

The way conversations feel also matters. When young people experience interest and understanding, they are more likely to reflect on their experiences and share what is important to them.

Families play an important role in supporting young people's engagement with school life. Feeling encouraged and supported at home can help children and young people navigate both learning and friendships.

Adolescence is often described as a time of challenge, but it is also a period of growth, learning, and increasing responsibility. When young people experience trust and encouragement, they are more likely to develop confidence in themselves and their choices.

Digital life continues to be part of everyday family life. Ongoing conversations about balance, rest, and routines can support young people's wellbeing over time.

We also want to acknowledge parents and carers. Supporting children and young people can be demanding, and your care, effort, and presence matter.

As we start the term, we look forward to continuing to work alongside families and young people, noticing what works well and building on this together.




