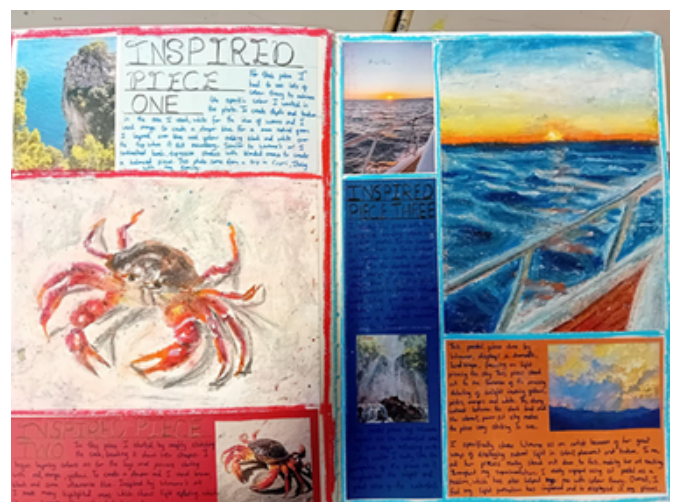

Some Year 11 students have taken the opportunity to finish off their Art coursework and have produced some amazing pieces of work, some of which you can see below.

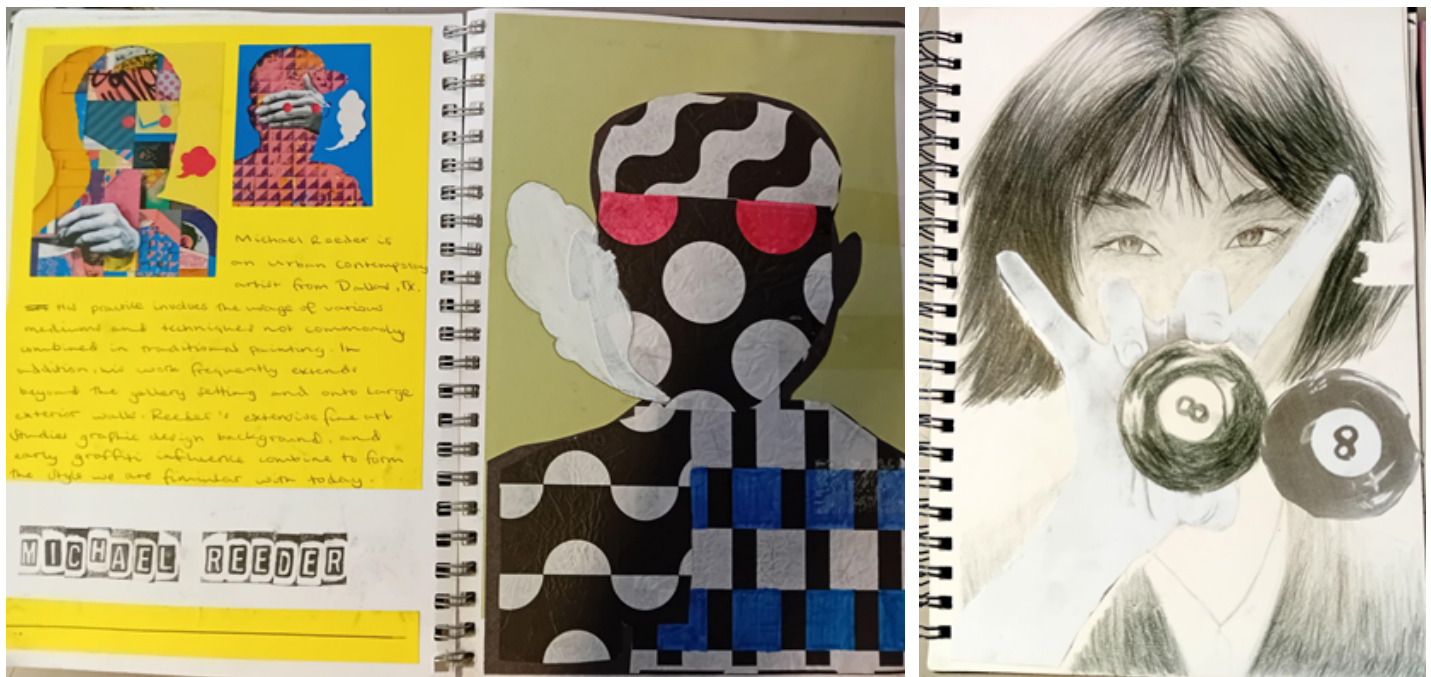

Teaching and Learning at Beechen Cliff - The Learning Cycle



Dear Beechen Parents and Carers,

I hope that your son/daughter has had a positive start back with us in 2026. I wanted to take this opportunity to share with you one of the things we are doing in lessons at the moment in order to improve student agency in their learning: the Learning Cycle.

This is the idea that all teachers follow a learning cycle in their lessons, and that we share each stage of the lesson with pupils so that they are aware of where they are in the lesson, which skill they are currently working on, and where they are going next.

Whilst the Learning Cycle is a very helpful planning tool for us as teachers, by sharing the stages of the cycle with our pupils, we hope to provide consistency and predictability for them across the school, as well as involving them in the conversation about their learning and about how they are learning.

The stages of the Learning Cycle are:

Do Now: A quick recall quiz on prior learning from last lesson, last week, last term, last year, as appropriate. This is a proven method in cognitive science which helps to anchor knowledge in the brain.

Engage: What are we learning and why? What's the point?! Why is this interesting/relevant? What are our learning objectives?

Learn: New knowledge is shared with pupils

Build: Pupils extend or deepen their knowledge through follow on tasks

Apply: Students apply their knowledge. This could be through a variety of tasks: extended writing, annotated drawings, group work, presentations, practicals, debates etc.

Review: Pupils review their learning at the end of the lesson- what have they learned? Have the learning objectives been met?

This is what our Do Now slide looks like:

We hope that by making our pupils aware of the parts of the learning cycle they are currently working on, they will start to recognise which skills they are using and that this will aid them in their learning, independent study, revision, and in their next steps after Beechen Cliff. By involving our students in conversations around their learning, we aim to bring them along with us and foster both independence and aspirations, two of our core values at Beechen Cliff.

Please speak to your son/daughter about the Learning Cycle and how it is helping them to better understand how they are learning in and out of school. It may also be useful to use some of the language of the learning cycle in homework and revision tasks at home.

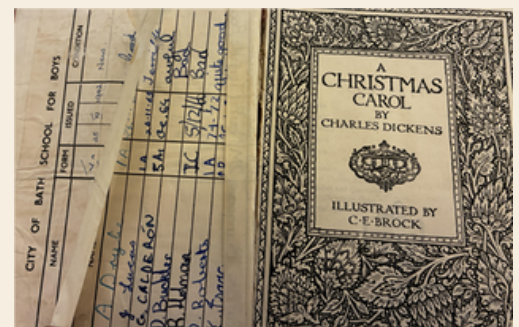

WELLBEING

Dear Parents,

In the Autumn term, Tara Gretton and Susie Ingram ran a Parent/Carer training session on the Solution Focused Approach that we use in school. We use this with our 1:1 therapy sessions with pupils in school and our staff use it too with all children. One of the things parents asked us was how to use this approach to de-escalate tricky conversations with their children, that can lead to arguments.

We all know the exhaustion that comes after a long day when a simple request—like asking your child to put away their shoes—spirals into an heated argument. These moments can leave both parents and children feeling frustrated and disconnected.

To help navigate these challenges, we want to share an insight into the Solution-Focused approach. Unlike traditional methods that dwell on why a problem started, this approach shifts the energy toward what is already working and what a "better" tomorrow looks like.

What is the Solution-Focused Approach?

The core idea is simple: We don't need to analyze the history of a conflict to find a way out of it. By focusing on the "solution" rather than the "problem," we can lower the temperature of arguments and build a more collaborative relationship with our children.

Three Practical Tools You Can Use Today

If you find yourself stuck in a cycle of arguing, try these three techniques:

1. Look for "Exceptions" Think of a time recently when a similar situation didn't result in an argument. What was different? Maybe the timing was better, or your tone was softer. By identifying these "exceptions," you can repeat the behaviors that already lead to success.
2. Use the "Miracle Question" Ask your child (and yourself): "If a miracle happened tonight and this problem was gone tomorrow, what would be the first small sign that things are better?" This helps move the conversation away from blame and toward specific, positive actions.
3. Scaling Questions On a scale of 1 to 10 (where 10 is a perfectly peaceful home), where are things today? If the answer is a 3, don't aim for a 10 immediately. Instead, ask: "What would it take to get us to a 4?" This makes progress feel manageable and less overwhelming.

Why It Works

When we focus on the problem, we often trigger a "defensive" response in children. When we focus on the solution, we invite them to be problem-solvers. This approach validates their feelings while giving them a clear path forward, helping to preserve the parent-child bond even during difficult moments.

We hope these tools provide a fresh perspective for your family. Small shifts in how we talk can lead to big changes in how we feel.

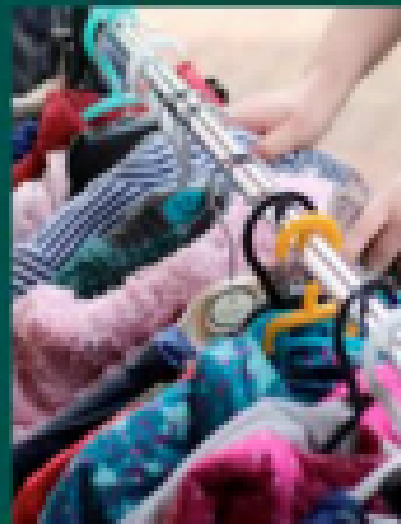
