


National Year of Reading 2026



This week, four of our avid readers took part in a regional heat in the Senior National Reading Champions Quiz. This quiz is organised by the National Literacy Trust and has been promoted as part of the National Year of Reading. We applied to be in the South West Region, but as it was full, we were put in an inter-regional heat with 25 schools from across the country. Ben P, Lucas A and Jem H (Y8) and Elliott D (Y7), spent the morning tackling 8 rounds of book-themed questions including picture rounds, quotations and even a video round. After a tense wait for the results, Beechen Cliff came third with an epic score of 52 out of 75 - a full 10 marks ahead of the fourth placed team.

Well done to the boys for being great quizzers and a special thanks to Lucas for stepping into the team at the last minute. All the boys win a £15 book token for winning 3rd place.

Thank you to the PTA for our fabulous new interactive screen, which was used for the first time for this amazing event. We appreciate all the fundraising you do to help our library!




Dear Parents and Carers,

A forensic linguist is a language expert who applies linguistic knowledge to legal contexts, acting as a detective to analyse written or spoken evidence. They investigate cases by examining idiolect (unique writing style), authorship of threats or notes, and contractual language, working with law enforcement and legal teams to uncover the truth.

West of England Legal Early Careers Network (WLECN) was established in 2022. In July of that year the network brought together 6 law firms and 5 schools to provide an opportunity for year 10 students to experience the work place through a week long insight programme. The scheme has been running every year since then, supported by more than 15 legal organisations including law firms of varying sizes, in-house legal teams, universities and a Judge! We have supported more than 25 schools and over 200 students by providing week long insight placements for year 10 students across Bristol and Bath, over a four week period, offering invaluable hands-on legal experience.

WHY WLECN?

In the legal sector, we know that the struggle for social mobility persists. Historically, it's not about what you know but who you know. Securing work placements, vacation schemes, and training contracts can feel like navigating a maze without connections. For those breaking new ground in their families, by obtaining GCSEs and A-levels, or heading to university, the lack of connections may be a barrier.

The West of England Legal Early Careers Network is a collective effort to move the dial on social mobility in the legal sector. Our network provides a platform for first-hand exposure to legal experience and invaluable connections.
