# Parent Survey Feedback

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our Year 7-11 Parent Questionnaire last month. We really value your feedback. It is an important tool to help us ensure we are providing the best possible education and school experience for your sons.

We are encouraged by your responses and pleased to see so many of you feel positive about their child's school experience, and we would like to share some of the key highlights with you:

- Happiness & Well-being: 96% of you shared that your son is happy here, with 93% feeling he is safe and well-cared for.
- School Culture: 94% feel the school has a clear vision, while 91% agree we promote positive behaviour.
- Engagement: 90% of students have taken part in extra-curricular activities, and 94% are pleased with the range of subjects offered.
- Support & Standards: 90% feel our staff are approachable, and 90% see their sons doing well under high expectations. 94% of those receiving Pupil Premium are happy with the care provided.
- Safety & Care: 94% reported that their son had either not experienced bullying or that it had been resolved swiftly and effectively.
- Community Pride: We are proud that 97% of you are pleased your son attends Beechen Cliff.

While these headlines are very positive, we remain focused on the work still to do. Our goal is for every student and parent to feel fully supported and all to have a positive experience. We are looking closely at your feedback to see where we can improve. In particular, feedback suggests we can provide more guidance to parents on what is being learnt during each academic year and there have been some occasions where parents feel communication with some members of staff could be improved. We are also in the process of contacting all parents who requested to be contacted following the survey and we hope to resolve any queries you have as soon as possible.



## COMPETITION TIME!


As part of our World Book Day celebrations, we are inviting students and staff to take part in a book character potato competition!

# Theme of The Week - Ramadan

There several reasons why Muslims fast.

1. It builds up **self control** and prevents greed.
  2. It reminds Muslims of what it is like to be **poor** and hungry. Hunger is the same for everybody so it is important to share that experience.
  3. It brings together Muslims from every background and reminds them that they are all equal in the sight of Allah (God).
  4. It gives Muslims more time to **pray**, to read the **Qur'an** and to help the poor (**Charity**).
  5. It is a test of obedience as fasting is a command from the Qur'an (**it is one of the five pillars**)
- For one month a year, Muslims around the world FAST during daylight hours. They get up everyday before sunrise in order to eat and drink enough to keep them going until sunset. After sunset the fast is broken and they are allowed to eat until sunrise the next day, when they fast again.
  - It commemorates the first revelation of the Quran to the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) according to Islamic belief. This annual observance is regarded as one of the Five Pillars of Islam.


The evening meal is often shared with family and friends, then followed with extra prayers and readings from the Qur'an.

## Muslims use a **lunar** calendar.

In a lunar calendar, a new month starts when there is a new moon.

This happens every 29 or 30 days, so the lunar month is usually 1 or 2 days shorter than a month in our calendar. A lunar year is about 11 days shorter than our year.

Because of this, dates in the Islamic lunar year "move forward" about 11 days every year.

**OPPORTUNITIES**

MEI is an educational charity that provides educational support and tools to inspire and develop mathematical proficiency and foster opportunities for all. Applications are currently open for their free Preparing for the STEP student course, designed to help Year 12 students strengthen their problem-solving skills ahead of the STEP (Sixth Term Examination Paper), the admissions assessment used primarily by the University of Cambridge, the University of Warwick and Imperial College London.

Applications for the Sutton Trust Summer Schools, aimed at Year 12 students from low socioeconomic backgrounds, are now open. The aim of the programme is to give you the chance to experience what university life is really like. Most applications close on 5 March. You may also be interested in other university summer schools, such as:

- Bristol Virtual Summer School
- Access to Sheffield Summer School
- Newcastle Bitesize Uni
- Birmingham National Access Summer School
- Durham Space to Explore Programme

The Exploring Law course has been designed by the University of Cambridge Faculty of Law to give you a real taste of what studying law at university involves. The major ambition is to enable you to decide whether a law degree is right for you, as well as to help you develop understanding and skills that will assist you when applying to university and then starting out as a law student.

The Big Work Experience Challenge runs from January to April and gives you the chance to explore real work experience, build skills, and take steps towards your future. This year, there's an extra way to stay motivated: Rockets. Rockets are points you earn for meaningful activity on Springspod – and during February and March, earning Rockets can also unlock real prizes. This guide explains how the Challenge works, what Rockets are, how to earn them, and how rewards work.

They promote songs for film/TV/ads, register works with collecting societies, and collect royalties. Key duties include creative A&R, copyright administration, and licensing to maximise income.

### THE MISSING HISTORY OF PRIVATE GODFREY The Actor ARNOLD RIDLEY

**T**ODAY Arnold Ridley is best remembered as the much-loved Dad's Army character, Private Godfrey, but the part of Godfrey came towards the end of a long theatrical career and a truly remarkable life. Having survived the horrors of the First World War and a stuttering start to his theatrical career, he began writing plays, one of which, *The Ghost Train*, enjoyed immense success. Many more successful West End plays followed alongside an involvement in the movie-making business which resulted in his financial ruin.

Evacuated from France in 1940, he was invalided out of the British Army for a second time, and then began his struggle to find a place in the new theatrical landscape. There followed many anxious years until the miracle of *Dad's Army* restored his faith in himself and at last provided him with a modest measure of renewed celebrity and security.

A well-drawn character can easily seem so complete that it's difficult to distinguish the fictional character from the actor. *Were You Anyone Before Dad's Army?* draws back the curtain and provides a touching, life-affirming account of one man's unwavering courage and resilience: a true hero, although he himself would certainly have disclaimed the label!
