This term, I had the privilege of attending the School Library Association's annual conference in Winchester, joining librarians from across the country to discuss the future of reading and literacy. I've returned with some exciting new ideas to ensure our provision remains dynamic, inclusive, and engaging for every student. Keeping our library relevant and inspiring is part of our core philosophy at Beechen Cliff. I look forward to sharing these new initiatives with students as we continue to champion reading as a lifelong skill.

Broadening Horizons:

We are expanding our definition of "reading." While traditional books remain vital, we are increasingly championing diverse formats—including graphic novels, audiobooks, and podcasts—to engage students who might not yet see themselves as "readers."

A "Third Space" for Learning:

We are developing the library as a vibrant "third space" — somewhere beyond the classroom and the home where students can explore ideas, debate, and engage with media in a creative, low-pressure environment.

Valuing Every Student:

Ensuring our collection reflects our school community. By curating more contemporary, issue-led fiction, we want to ensure every student feels seen and valued, while also providing "windows" into the diverse lives and perspectives of others.

Navigating the Modern World:

In an era of misinformation, we are strengthening our commitment to media literacy. We'll be running activities that help students think critically about the information they encounter online, ensuring they have the skills to navigate the digital world with confidence.

READING TESTS - Year 10 (Weeks 3 and 4)

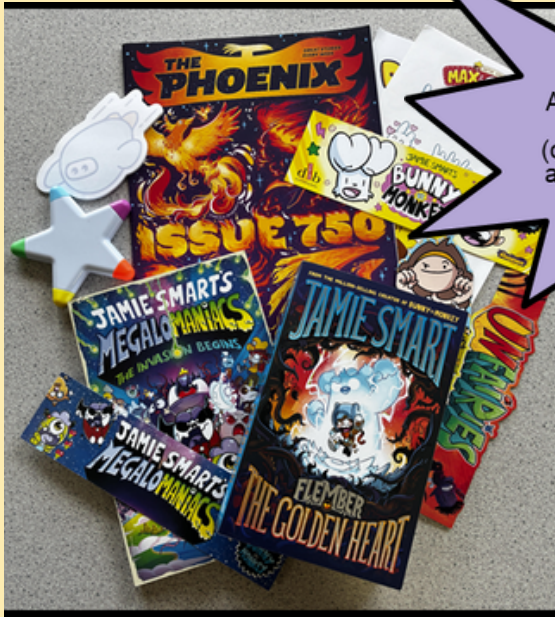

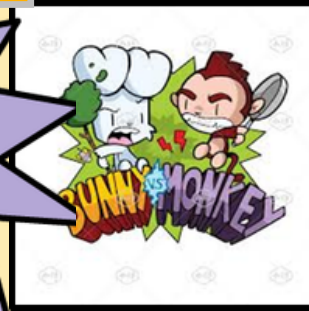

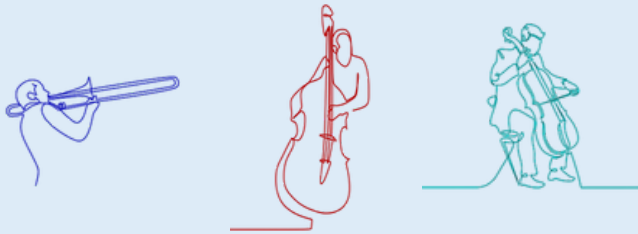
BEECHEN CLIFF YOUNG MUSICIAN 2026

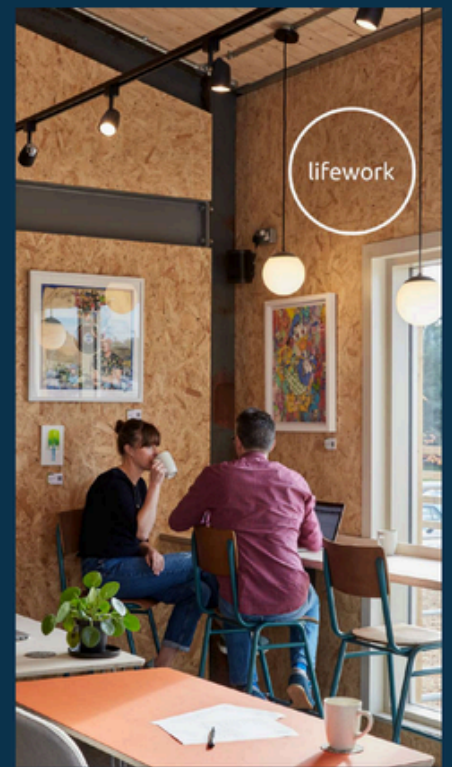

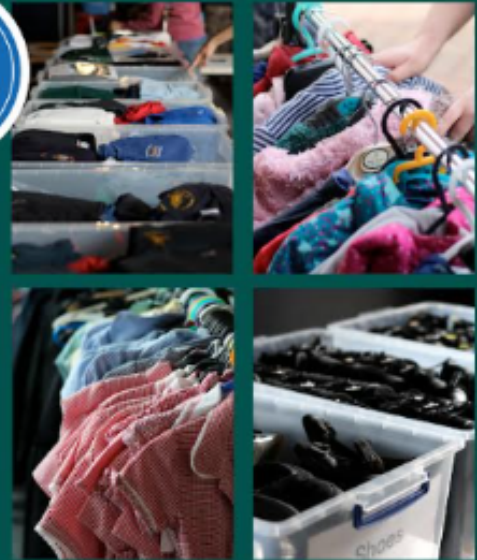
