Tutor Rewards 2025–26: Celebrating a Year of Achievement

As we reach the end of another successful academic year, it is time to celebrate the achievements of our tutor groups through the annual Tutor Rewards competition. Throughout the year, students earned positive points for demonstrating excellent attitudes to learning, commitment to school life, resilience, kindness, and consistently upholding our school values. Behaviour points were also recorded and deducted from these totals, with final scores averaged across each tutor group's size to ensure a fair comparison.

The Tutor Rewards programme recognises not only individual success but also the collective effort of tutor groups working together to create a positive and productive school community.



Each winning tutor group will have a Domino's Pizza next week (Year 7 and 9 on Monday and Year 8 and 10 on Tuesday).

Year 7: A Fantastic Start

Year 7 students made an exceptional start to their secondary school journey, earning more than 5,500 positive points between them. The standout performers were Y7 Milton A, who achieved an outstanding average of 43.9 points per student, making them not only the Year 7 champions but also the highest-scoring tutor group in the school. They were followed by Y7 Byron A and Y7 Milton B, who also produced excellent results throughout the year.

Year 8: A Closely Contested Competition

The Year 8 rankings were among the closest in the school, with only fractions of a point separating the top three positions. Y8 Byron claimed first place with an average of 21.9 points per student, narrowly ahead of Y8 Milton (21.7) and Y8 Kipling B (21.5). The competition highlighted the importance of consistency, with every positive point making a difference in the final standings.

Year 9: Balancing Positives and Behaviour

Year 9 students accumulated an impressive number of positive points, demonstrating resilience and commitment as they prepared for the next stage of their education. Y9 Kipling emerged as deserved winners with an average of 16.7 points per student, ahead of Y9 Milton A and Y9 Byron B. The results showed how maintaining positive behaviour alongside earning rewards can have a significant impact on overall success.

Year 10: Success in a Crucial Year

As students began their GCSE studies, Year 10 continued to demonstrate commitment and determination. Y10 Milton/Shakespeare B secured first place with an excellent average of 18.5 points per student, finishing ahead of Y10 Byron and Y10 Kipling/Byron A. Their achievement reflects a year of sustained effort and positive contributions both inside and outside the classroom.

Tutor Rewards Champions 2025–26

Year 7: Y7 Milton A – 43.9 points per student

Year 8: Y8 Byron – 21.9 points per student

Year 9: Y9 Kipling – 16.7 points per student

Year 10: Y10 Milton/Shakespeare B – 18.5 points per student

Looking Back on the Year

Across Years 7–10, students earned over 15,000 positive points, reflecting thousands of examples of excellent effort, kindness, leadership, perseverance, and positive behaviour.

The Tutor Rewards competition continues to demonstrate that success is built through everyday actions. Every positive contribution, whether in lessons, around the school, or within the wider community, helps create an environment where everyone can thrive.

Congratulations to all students and tutors for their hard work throughout the year. A special well done goes to our four year-group champions and to Y7 Milton A, whose remarkable score made them the highest-performing tutor group in the school for 2025–26.

We look forward to seeing which tutor groups will rise to the challenge and claim the Tutor Rewards titles next year!

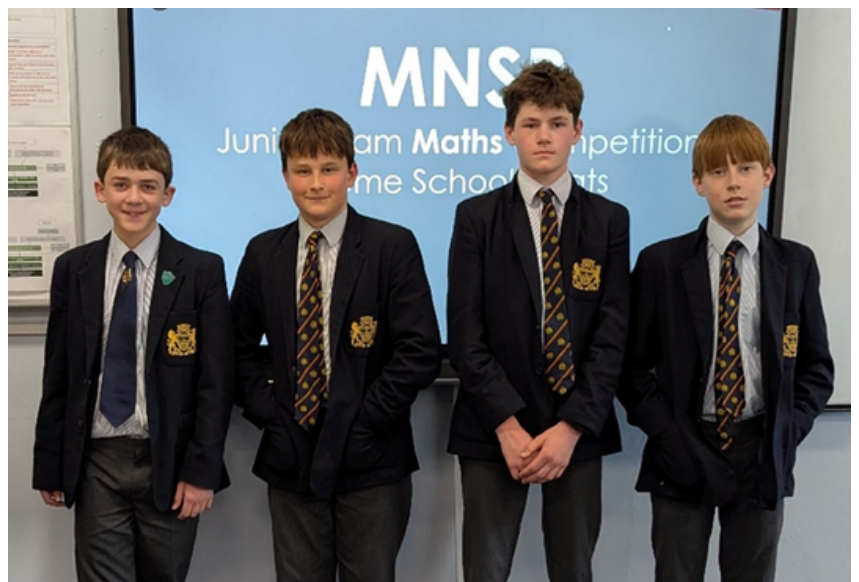
Inter House Maths Team Challenge

Please find below two messages from our Equalities Senior Prefects tying into Pride Month, something we are proud to support at Beechen Cliff School.

"Pride is something which since its creation has remained important to celebrate, remember, and think about. In 65 countries around the world homosexuality is still a crime and according to Stonewall UK, 70% of LGBTQ+ people in the UK have experienced harassment because of their sexuality or gender identity. This is why since Pride's creation in 1970 it has been important to celebrate and educate. Even in this country there is still work to do and a future generation without prejudice starts with us. This is why this Pride month we want all students to think carefully about how they act and what they say and hopefully think about the issues that LGBTQ+ people still face. Thoughts are messages from your brain. You do not have to believe every one.

1 SPOT IT

Ask yourself:

- What am I telling myself right now?
- Is this a thought or a fact?
- Would everyone agree it is true?

2 NAME IT

Try saying:

- "I am having the thought that..."
- "My brain is telling me..."
- "A worry has shown up..."

This creates space between you and the thought.

3 TEST IT

Ask:

- What evidence supports this?
- What evidence does not?
- What would I tell a friend?

4 CHOOSE YOUR NEXT STEP

Instead of asking: "How do I stop feeling this?"

Try asking: "What helps me move forward anyway?"

Examples:

- ♥ Send the message
- ♥ Attend the lesson
- ♥ Take the walk
- ♥ Ask for help
- ♥ Start for 5 minutes

You can't control every thought... but you can **choose** what you do next.

Thoughts are not orders.

Feelings are not forever.

Small actions matter.

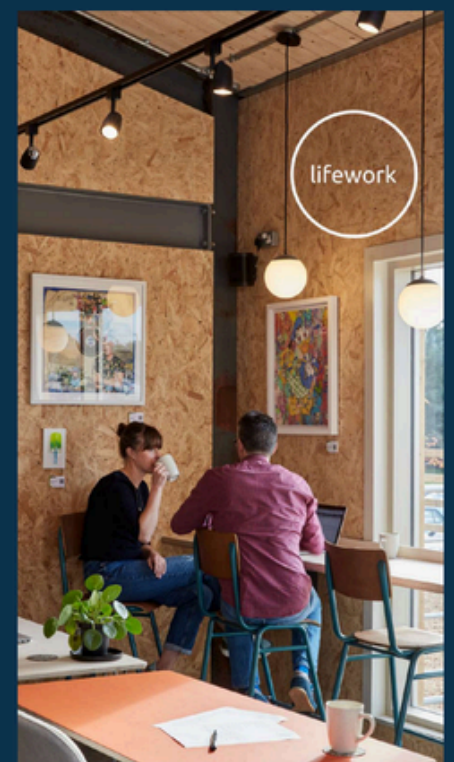

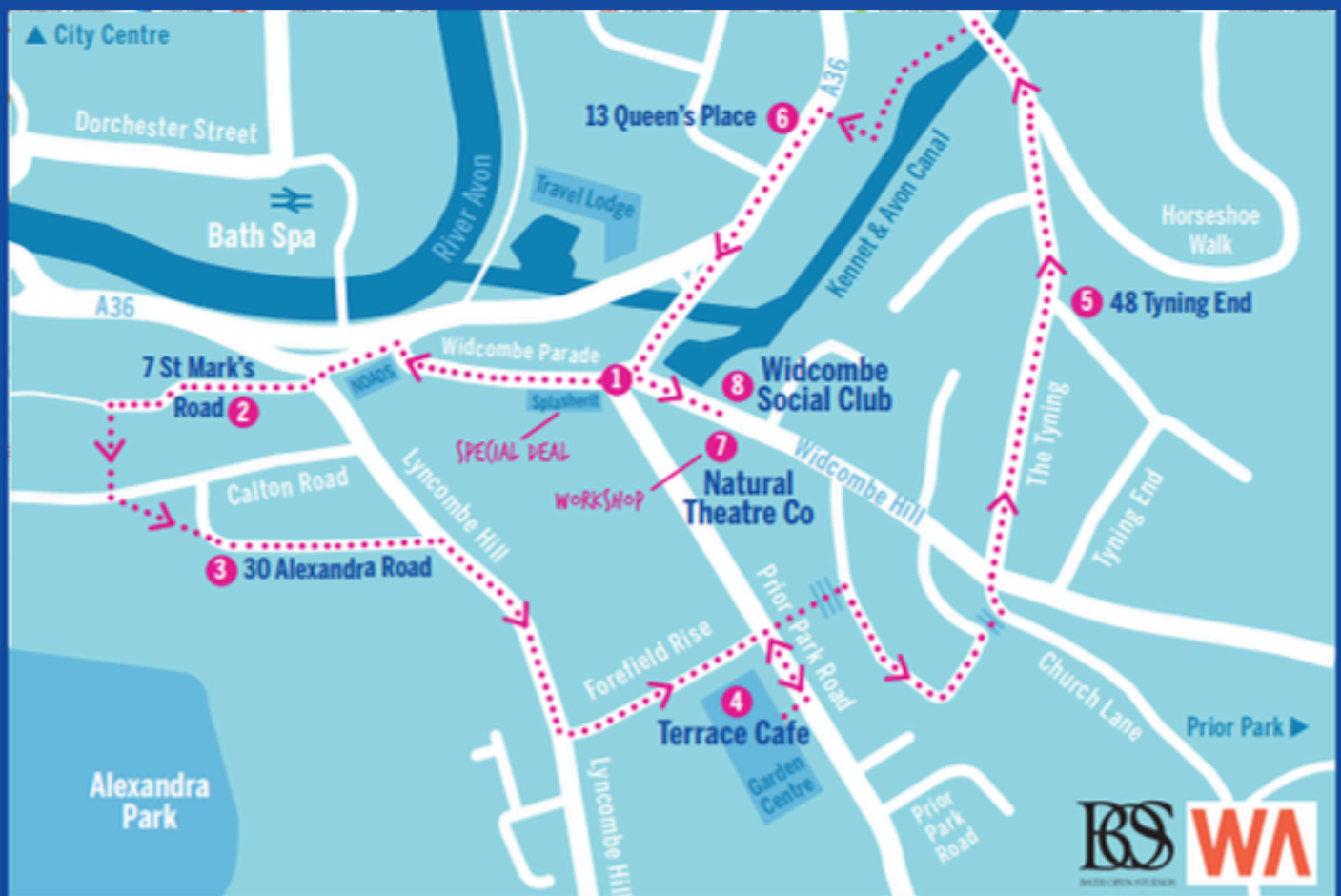
