Results from public examinations will be available for collection in the Main School Hall at the following times:

A Level

Year 13 (A level and equivalent results) –
Thursday 13th August 2026 from 9.00am until 10.30am in the Main School Hall.

The Sixth Form team will be on hand to help with queries and advice about next steps until 11.30am. Level 3 Sport students who are awaiting results are welcome (and encouraged) to attend.

All A Level results for students in Year 12 will be emailed to students' school email addresses, so there is no need to attend in person - though again, students are more than welcome to come into school to celebrate their results.

GCSE

GCSE and equivalent results (Year 11) –
Thursday 20th August 2026 from 9.30am - 11.00am in the main School Hall.

All other GCSE results for students not in Year 11 will be emailed to students' school email addresses.

There will be support available on next steps from teachers, Mrs Pascoe (Head of Careers) and the Sixth Form Team for those hoping to continue their education at Beechen Cliff into Year 12.

For students who are hoping to enroll in the Sixth Form here, they must complete the online enrolment form on Applicaa by 12.00pm on Results Day.

Results via email

It is recommended that results are collected in person. However, if a student wishes to receive their results by email this must be pre-arranged with the Examinations Office, and the student must make the request for results to be emailed, not a parent or carer.

Results will then be emailed to the student's school email address as soon as possible, and before 2.00pm on Results Day. If a student wishes a parent or another adult to collect results on their behalf, the student must send an email to exams@beechencliff.mnsp.org.uk or the person collecting must bring a letter on Results Day signed by the student stating the name of the person to collect. This person must bring photo ID on the day.

Could Your Child be Eligible for Free School Meals?

From September 2026, more families may be able to receive free school meals.

At the moment, children can qualify if their household receives Universal Credit and has annual earnings of £7,400 or less. From September, a new eligibility category will be introduced, meaning that families receiving Universal Credit may qualify regardless of their earnings.

This change means that many families who have not previously been eligible may now be able to apply.

A calm, quiet space to read and work

This week, reading age standardised scores (RASS) results for all students who took their reading test this term have been sent to parents.

Please look for the email containing these results and the descriptors that explain the scores.

A reading age standardised score compares a student's reading performance with that of other students of the same age. A score of 100 is average for their age group, with higher scores indicating stronger reading skills and lower scores suggesting that additional practice may be helpful.

As with any assessment, results provide a snapshot of performance on the day and may be affected by factors such as effort, concentration, or how regularly a student reads. Encouraging regular reading at home is one of the best ways to support reading development and improve confidence.

At Beechen Cliff we have high aspirations for our students and want them to be able to read fluently. This is to help them access the school curriculum across all subjects and also to be able to develop a life-long love of reading.

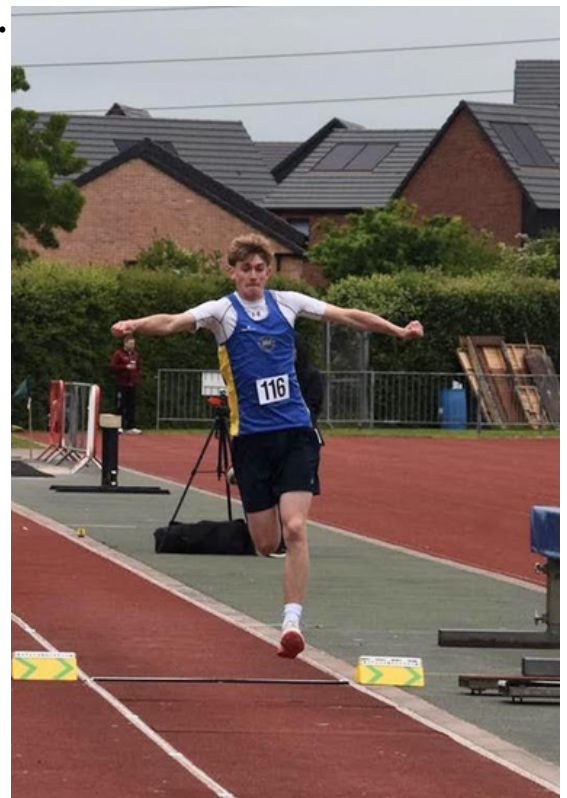
Extra Curricular Activities and Sporting Events

Silver DofE Practice Expedition - 26th - 28th June.

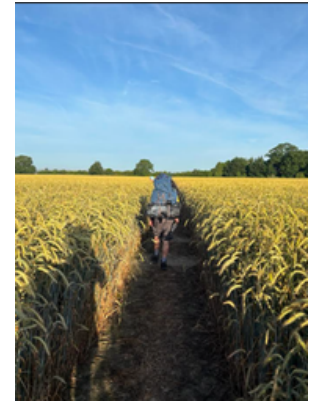
With many alterations to the plan the silver DofE group set off early on the Friday morning for Marlborough Downs. Groups were equipped for the heat with hats, sunscreen and water

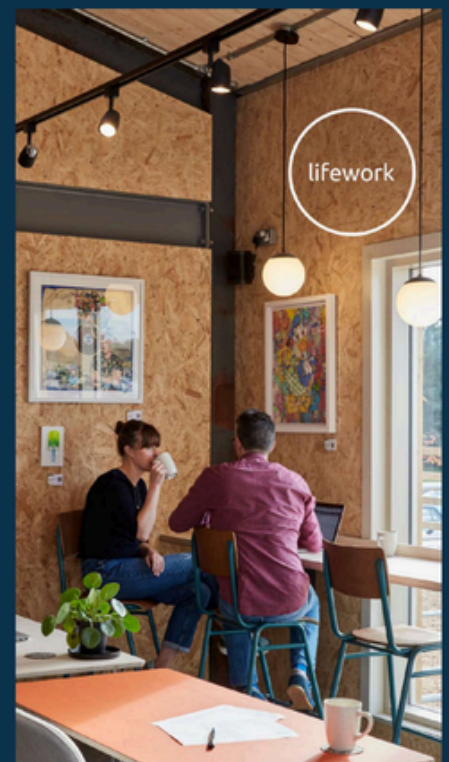
