### Message from the Headteacher

#### Welcome back to a new school year!

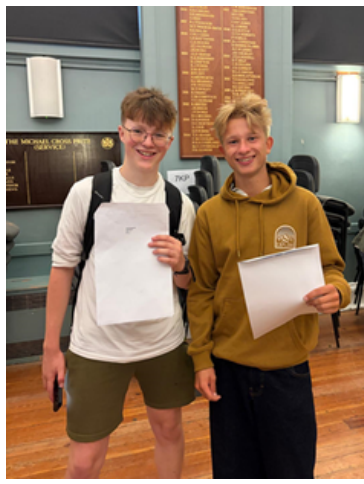
It has been lovely to welcome students back to school this week after the summer break and I hope it has been a positive start to the term whether a returning student or new to the school. I hope all new students and staff will settle in quickly and soon feel fully part of the Beechen Cliff Community and I wish everyone a happy and successful year ahead.

#### Examination Results

At the start of the year, I must also congratulate our outgoing Year 11 and 13 students on an excellent set of examinations results in the summer.

At GCSE, 87% of grades achieved were grades 9-4 and 37% were grades 9-7, well above the national averages for England this year.

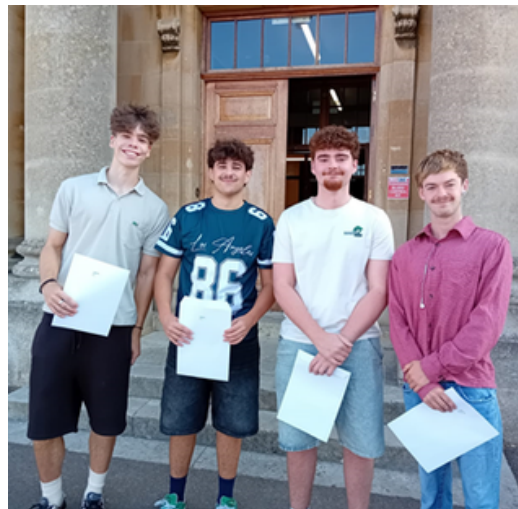
83% of pupils achieved a grade 4 or above in both English and Maths (70% achieved a grade 5 or above vs 46% nationally) and 55% of pupils achieved the EBacc. These excellent results have given them a strong basis for the next stage of their education and students are now moving on to Sixth Form, College, Apprenticeships and, in a couple of cases, professional sports contracts.

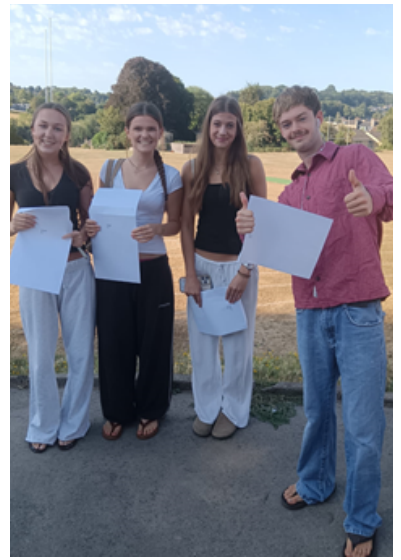




At A Level, 30% of grades achieved were A\*/A grades, 60% were at A\*-B and 85% of grades were at A\*-C, also above the national average for England this year. Students studying vocational courses also achieved excellent results with an average grade of a Distinction.

85% of our Year 13 students are about to embark on their next steps at University with many others embarking upon a gap year first before applying next year. 55% of applicants gained a place at a Russell Group university. Our most popular university destinations this year were the universities of Manchester, Exeter and Cardiff. We have also had a very successful year for apprenticeship applicants with students beginning their careers in Real Estate, Chartered Surveying, and Policing. Other fantastic destinations include the armed forces, professional sporting contracts and employment.





A big congratulations to all students on their examination results and we wish them all the very best with their next steps in education or employment.

### **Looking ahead**

Moving forward, it's exciting to think about the opportunities in the year ahead. I look forward to working with you all and hope to see many of you at our parent information evenings or other events throughout the school year.

# Welcome Back and Updates from Mr Morris, Assistant Headteacher

After a busy and memorable end to the Summer Term, including Activities Week, Work Experience and the celebration of our pupils' achievements through the examination results, it has been a wonderfully positive start to the new academic year. The summer break already feels a distant memory as we have welcomed everyone back to Beechen Cliff and begun what promises to be another exciting and rewarding year.

The first few days of term have been an important opportunity for the Pastoral Team to re-establish the routines, systems and expectations that underpin daily life at Beechen Cliff. Following the long break, it is important that these are revisited so that everyone is clear about what is expected and feels confident and prepared for the year ahead. As pupils returned on Monday, they were welcomed by their Head of Year and began the process of settling back into school through assemblies, before meeting with their tutors to revisit timetables, routines and the high standards we expect in relation to organisation, behaviour and attendance as well as our new phone pouch system; of which the presentation is linked below. We want every pupil to begin the year in the best possible position to embrace the opportunities and challenges that lie ahead.

Over the course of the coming week, we also ask you to look out for an introductory email from your son's tutor. This will provide an opportunity for tutors to introduce themselves and establish that important first point of contact should you need to get in touch during the year.

As we do at the beginning of each academic year, we have also taken time as a community to reflect upon and reaffirm our commitment to the values that define Beechen Cliff. Pupils and staff have signed the School Charter, demonstrating their commitment to upholding our shared values of aspiration, compassion, independence and respect, and contributing to a community in which everyone can aspire to achieve their potential and develop into confident, compassionate and well-rounded individuals who go on to live fulfilled lives and make a positive contribution to society.

Alongside the School Charter, pupils have undertaken dedicated teaching and reflection around our Pledge of Respect before formally committing to its principles. The Pledge has been developed by our pupils, through the work of the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and Senior Prefect Team, and provides practical guidance on how we can all support one another, demonstrate respect and challenge behaviours that may cause harm or offence. It also highlights sources of support and encourages our pupils to have the confidence to speak up when something is not right.

At the heart of this are four simple but powerful commitments:

- We treat all people with KINDNESS and COMPASSION.
- We ASPIRE to be a community where everyone is free to be themselves.
- We RESPECT the rights and needs of every member of our school community.
- We are INDEPENDENT in our understanding of what is right, and do the right thing even when no one is looking.

By making these commitments, our pupils recognise the importance of respecting and celebrating difference, supporting one another and treating everyone fairly and equally, regardless of their individual characteristics. Our ambition is for every member of the Beechen Cliff community to enjoy a positive experience of school and to leave with a positive impression of the community of which they are a part.

We would encourage you to talk with your son or daughter about the work undertaken this week and the commitments they have made. These conversations at home are an important way of reinforcing the messages and values we are establishing in school. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your son's tutor, who will be happy to offer advice or direct you to the most appropriate member of the pastoral team.

Please also take the opportunity to review the Home School Agreement linked below. This sets out the respective roles and responsibilities of pupils, parents and the school, and reinforces our shared commitment to ensuring that every pupil is able to thrive. Sometimes, the simplest things make the biggest difference: ensuring that your son or daughter arrives each day with the correct equipment, dressed appropriately and ready to learn is a great way to support a successful start to the year.

We are looking forward to the months ahead with real optimism. Here's to a year filled with kindness, ambition, progress and achievement, and to another successful year for the whole Beechen Cliff community

## Welcome Back: The Power of a Strong Start and Good Attendance

As we begin the new academic year at Beechen Cliff, I am writing to welcome all returning pupils and extend a warm welcome to those families joining our school community for the first time. The start of September represents a clean slate, a chance to set high standards, and an opportunity for every pupil to build strong habits that will support them throughout the year.

At Beechen Cliff, we want every student to thrive academically, socially, and emotionally. The single most critical foundation for this success is simple: being here, on time, every day. It is important to remember that attendance is vital for personal development. Missing school means missing out on sports, clubs, pastoral support, and the daily social interactions that build confidence, friendships, and a strong sense of belonging.

Punctuality in the morning is also vital, as it sets up every pupil to have a successful day in school. Traffic and buses are a particular issue on Bear Flat at the moment due to ongoing roadworks. These are due to last until the end of November, so travel times may well need to be adjusted to allow for likely delays in getting to school.

We recognise that attendance is not always straightforward. Barriers can arise—whether related to anxiety, physical health, special educational needs, family challenges, or morning routines. Please know that we are here to work with you. If your child is struggling or finding the transition back into school difficult, we urge you to reach out early - please contact your son's/daughter's tutor or Head of Year to discuss ways in which we can support them.

# Bear Flat Road Works

You may be aware that roadworks at Bear Flat began earlier this summer and are expected to continue until late November

The project includes:

- Improved bus facilities
- New raised continuous crossings at Hayes Place, Bruton Avenue and Shakespeare Avenue
- Changes to the Wells Road crossing to make it safer and more convenient for pedestrians

As always, we encourage anyone who can use local bus services or walk to and from school to do so. This helps reduce congestion around the avenues surrounding the school and on Wellsway, making journeys safer and easier for everyone.

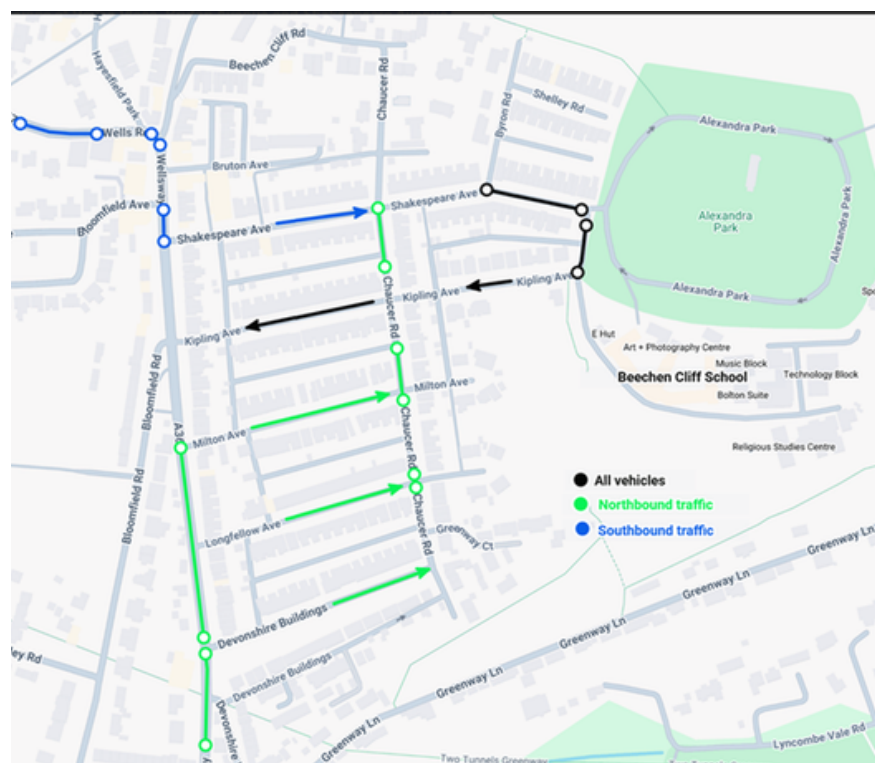
For those needing to drive, we would normally encourage you to use the informal one way system by entering via Shakespeare Avenue, dropping off near the gate at the top of Kipling Avenue and exiting via Kipling Avenue. Alternatively, many parents choose to drop their children off at the car park by Cook on Bear Flat and children walk up the hill, reducing traffic congestion on the avenues.

However, during the roadworks, temporary traffic arrangements are in place and therefore please allow extra time for your journey.

Until Friday 18th September, contractors will be working on the first phase of construction, including installing a raised crossing on Shakespeare Avenue. During these works, northbound traffic will not be able to turn right into Shakespeare Avenue.

Parents and carers approaching from the south of Bath are advised to enter the area via Devonshire Buildings, Longfellow Avenue or Milton Avenue, then continue along Chaucer Avenue to join Shakespeare Avenue. From there, please follow the informal one-way system, dropping off near the top of Kipling Avenue before exiting via Kipling Avenue.

Drivers approaching from Bath and travelling south will still be able to turn left into Shakespeare Avenue and should follow the usual informal one-way route (as described above).



# LIBRARY NEWS

## Welcome Back: The books have missed you!

I'd like to take this opportunity to introduce new pupils and parents to the library and to remind current pupils and parents of some of the ways the library can be used

### Resources

We have around 4000 books, magazines and graphic novels, a listening station for audiobooks, quizzes, puzzles, games and much more. All pupils are able to borrow two items for up to three weeks. After this time they must return the items, or bring them back to the library to be renewed for a further three weeks

If books are not returned on time, the pupils will receive a reminder via email and their tutor. Books should always be signed out with the librarian and returned to the return box (not put back on the shelves).

**Note: any previous overdue books have now been marked as 'lost'. Your son will only receive notices about this year's overdue books.**

Our resident solution focused practitioners, Susie Ingram and Tara Gretton, provide one-to-one support and group work for students through our counselling service. We are both solution focused practitioners and therapists, and we also offer parent training in the solution focused approach. Details are to follow regarding the training.

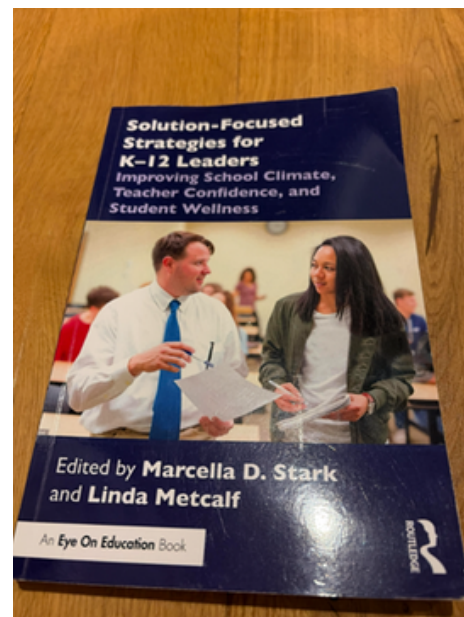
Solution focused practice is an approach used across the school. It focuses on building towards preferred futures, developing self-belief and helping young people recognise their own resources and capabilities as they navigate the complexities of their young lives. Alongside this, we have a strong focus on supporting general wellbeing and creating a school environment where young people feel included, connected and able to flourish

This way of working sits closely alongside the growing emphasis within education on **children's wellbeing, inclusion and helping every child to achieve and thrive.**

The Department for Education's 2026 paper, Every child achieving and thriving, sets out this ambition for children and young people, while government guidance on promoting children and young people's mental health and wellbeing highlights the importance of a whole-school approach

These principles speak very much to the way we work at Beechen Cliff, and we look forward to sharing more with you about our approach, our work and some of the ideas that underpin it throughout the academic year.

We've also attached an image of a book published in 2024, featuring a chapter sharing the story of the development of solution-focused practice at Beechen Cliff.



The book supports secondary schools to use the solution-focused approach across school life, and we're delighted to see our work at Beechen Cliff included.

We'll be sharing more about our approach throughout the year.

# Musical Theatre in partnership with Bath Theatre School and Hayesfield Girls School



We have been delighted with the success of the joint Oklahoma, West Side Story, Shrek and High School Musical productions between Beechen Cliff and Hayesfield in partnership with Bath Theatre School over the last four years. We would, therefore, like to continue this collaboration for the next academic year to build up to a professional production in March 2027. The production we will be working towards will be decided shortly and we look forward to sharing details with you.

For the academic year 2026/2027, the sessions will continue on a Friday afternoon, based at Beechen Cliff for two hours after school from 3.30pm-5.30pm. They will run from September (beginning on 11th September 2026) through to Term 5 with the opportunity to participate in the production in Term 4. The production will take place in the Roper Theatre at Hayesfield School. Throughout the year students will work with professional tutors in dance, singing and acting. There will be a minimum of 30 sessions over the year.

Instead of a weekly charge, the total costs of the activity will be broken down into 4 payments of £80 payable at the start of Terms 1-4 (payable directly to Bath Theatre School). This means no payments will be required for Terms 5 and 6. As well as the professional tutoring, the cost includes the contribution towards the production costs and costumes. This is a heavily subsidised cost to try and ensure as many students can access this opportunity as possible and there will be additional support for students who are eligible for Pupil Premium.

In order for this project to be successful we will need a minimum of 60 pupils to take part across both schools (although we have the capacity for up to 70).

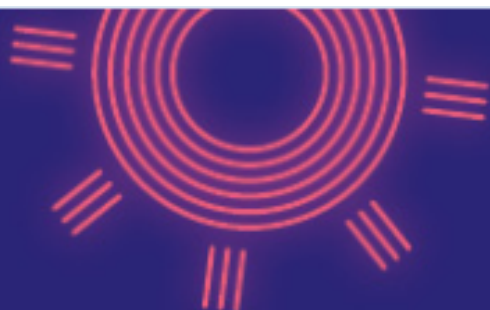
