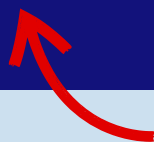

Most students* should now be able to login to the school system, both at school and at home. School usernames are as follows:

Year 7: 20firstname.surname
Year 8: 19firstname.surname
Year 9: 18firstname.surname
Year 10: 17firstname.surname

Year 11: 16firstname.surname
L6th: 15firstname.surname
U6th: 14firstname.surname

If logging in from home, add @beehechencliff.mnsp.org.uk to the username. E.g.
20firstname.surname@beehechencliff.mnsp.org.uk

Students with double-barrelled surnames may have had their names abbreviated and should ask their tutor or Computing teacher if they are unsure what their login is.

Students should have logged in at school by now, and therefore have reset their passwords and should know what they are. If your son or daughter is having issues, please ask them to speak with their tutor in the first instance. If the problem persists, they can go to IT Support on the lower corridor in the main building to ask for a password reset.

To access Google Classroom, Google Drive and other school platforms from home, pupils should go to the school website, scroll down to the bottom of the homepage and click on 'Student Intranet'. Once they have entered their login details, it will take them to the school homepage with the launchpad for all of the programmes they will need.

* Unfortunately there are a small number of pupils who are still unable to access the Google Suite due to a licensing issue we are having with Google. We are working with Google to fix this ASAP. In the meantime, teachers are aware and have been asked to provide these pupils with paper copies of any homework set.

All first and second priority email addresses have been synced with Google Classroom. You should have received an email from Google Classroom inviting you to start receiving weekly summaries of your son or daughter's homework (if you have a Gmail account, you can set these to daily if you prefer). Online Safety

Firstly, I would like to say how well our pupils have responded to the mobile phone ban in school and the use of their pouches - they have adapted to new routines very quickly. However, even with the ban in schools in place, digital devices, homework platforms, and online games still play an increasingly central role in our children's daily lives—regardless of their age. Whether your child is taking their first steps online or navigating social media and group chats independently, helping them build safe digital habits is a shared priority.

To support families across every year group, we recommend bookmarking this practical resource from Internet Matters: [Online Safety Advice Hub for Families](#).

This interactive hub allows you to access tailored advice for your child's exact age and activities, including:

- Age-Specific Guides: Clear boundary-setting advice tailored from early years through to older teenagers.
- Step-by-Step Control Guides: How to set up age-appropriate privacy controls and screen-time limits on phones, consoles, and tablets.
- App & Gaming Overviews: Simple guides explaining popular platforms like Roblox, WhatsApp, YouTube, and TikTok.
- Conversation Starters: Tips on how to talk openly with your child about online safety so they feel comfortable turning to you if something goes wrong.

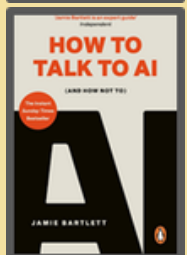
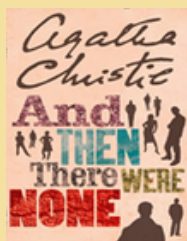

Graphic novels continue to be really popular, with One Piece being the favourite so far.

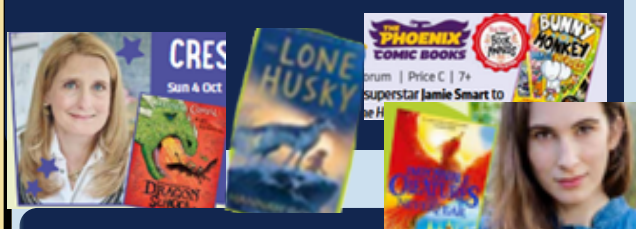
Sport books remain popular, with biographies topping this week's chart, and non-fiction books based on news topics are also catching our students' attention. What will you be reading next?

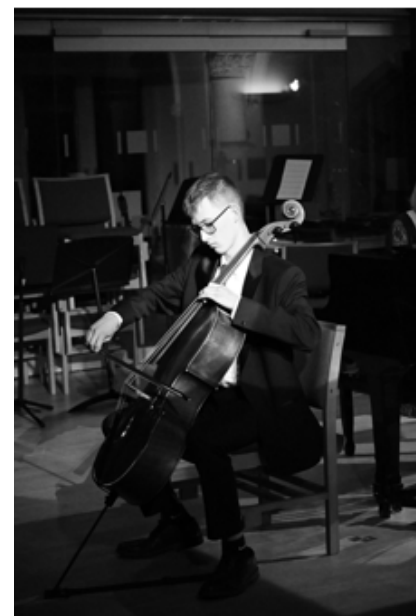

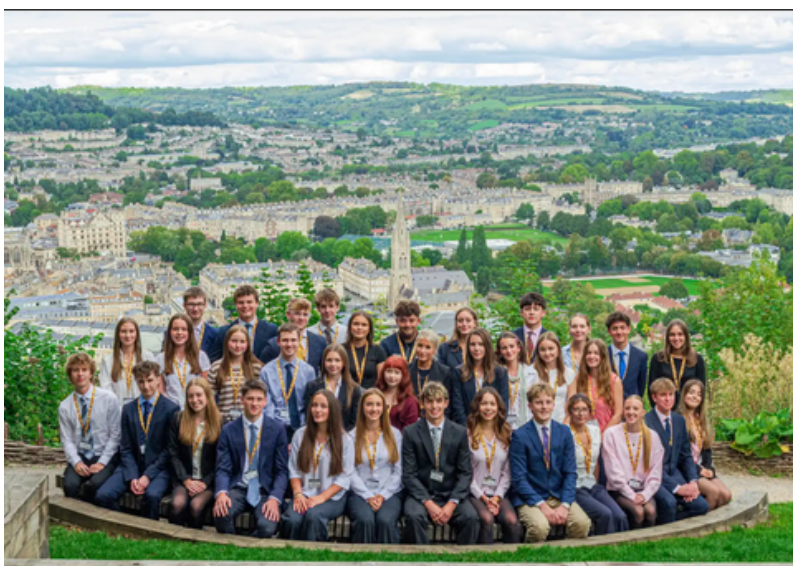
Senior Prefect Team

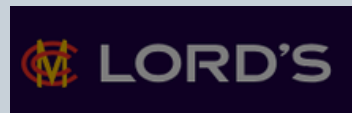

WELLBEING

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week's Wellbeing entry introduced new parents to the whole school approach to wellbeing that we are so proud of at Beechen Cliff School, using the Solution Focused approach.

This week, and in our future weekly Wellbeing entries, we hope to introduce you to how you, as parents and carers, can use the Solution Focused approach at home with your children. We hope that this will provide you with a really useable introduction to help you decide whether you would like to attend the Parent and Carer Solution Focused Training, later in the academic year (details to follow)



Notice What's Already Working

A few weeks into the new school year, it can be very easy to notice the things that aren't quite working yet.

The forgotten PE kit. The rushed morning. The homework left until the last minute. The friendship wobble. The teenager who suddenly seems exhausted by Wednesday!

As parents and carers, our instinct is often to focus on these things because we want to help.

But this week, we'd like to invite you to try something slightly different.

Look for what's already working.

This is one of the simplest ideas behind the Solution Focused Approach. Rather than always starting with "What's the problem?", we become curious about the moments when things are going even slightly better.

Perhaps your young person got themselves up on time three mornings this week.

Perhaps they walked through the school gates despite feeling anxious.

Maybe they completed some homework without being reminded, handled a difficult friendship better than they might have done last year, joined something new, made someone laugh, asked for help—or simply kept going when the week felt difficult.

These things can be easy to miss.

Yet they tell us something important about the strengths, skills and resources a young person already has.



Catch Them Doing Something Right

Teenagers receive an enormous amount of feedback about what they need to do next:

Have you done your homework?

Have you packed your bag?

Have you revised?

Have you tidied your room?

This week, try deliberately catching them doing something right.

And tell them what you noticed.

“I noticed you were really kind to your brother then.”

“You seemed much more organised this morning.”

“That looked difficult, but you dealt with it.”

“I noticed you kept going.”

They may shrug.

They may appear completely unimpressed!

But being noticed matters.

When we repeatedly help young people recognise what they are doing well, we help them build a richer picture of themselves—not simply as someone who is struggling with something, but as someone who already has strengths they can draw upon.



Try a Different Question

Instead of:

“How was school?”

Try:

“What was the best bit of today?”

Or:

“What went better today than yesterday?”

And if the answer is “nothing”, that’s okay too.

You might simply ask:

“What made today bearable?”

Sometimes the smallest exception is where a useful conversation begins.



This Week's Small Step

Choose one thing you appreciate about your young person and tell them.

Nothing elaborate. No lecture attached. No “but...” at the end.

Just notice it.

Because sometimes change doesn't begin by fixing what's going wrong.

Sometimes it begins by noticing what's already going right.



A Moment to Reflect

Before this week ends, pause for a moment and think:

What has my young person done since returning to school that I am quietly proud of?

Then, if you can, tell them.

They might not show you that it matters.

But there's a very good chance it will.

The Wellbeing Team

What does it take for a school to genuinely thrive?

And what happens when wellbeing isn't another initiative, but becomes part of the way a school works?

On 9–10 April 2027, school and trust leaders, governors, policymakers and practitioners will come together at Beechen Cliff School in Bath for two days of conversation, exploration and practical thinking about creating cultures in which both people and schools can thrive.

The gathering draws on eight years of experience at Beechen Cliff, exploring what has happened when a different way of working has been woven into the everyday life of a school.

We will look beyond individual wellbeing initiatives to consider the wider culture of a school, and the connections between staff retention, attendance, inclusion, behaviour, relationships and engagement in learning.

This isn't a traditional conference.

There won't be a series of experts telling schools what they should be doing. Instead, it will be a working gathering: a chance to share experience, challenge thinking, explore what is already working and consider what might make the greatest difference in your own school or trust.

At its heart is a simple question:

How can we create school cultures where people have the opportunity to do well, feel well and contribute well?

The event is hosted by Solution Focus in Organisations (SFIO), drawing on the principles and experience that have informed the work at Beechen Cliff and in schools and organisations beyond it.

If this feels like a conversation worth being part of, we would love to welcome you to Bath.

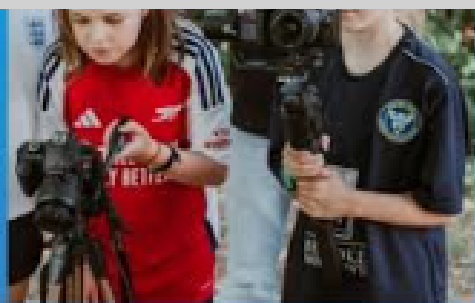

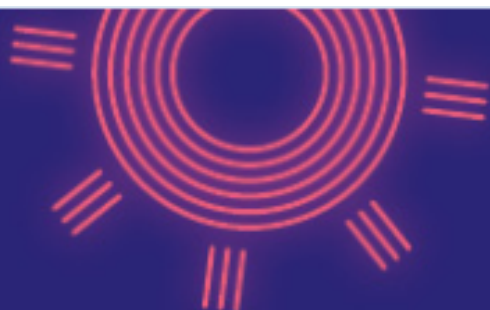
